The evolution and growth of the college has been phenomenal. Apart from the regular streams of Arts, Science and Commerce, the college also offers self-financing courses like BBA, BCA, PGDCA, MBA, MCA, B.Sc.-Biotech, and one add-on course which benefits the students not only from Himachal but also from Northern India. The vision and mission of this educational institution has been to impart knowledge, build careers, develop skills and focus on holistic growth and development of each and every student so that they are competent enough to face the challenges of a bigger world.

The pages of this report will speak volumes of the achievements of this educational institution. I may please be permitted to present before you the annual report for the academic session 2016-17.

STAFF

The college has a total number of 76 sanctioned posts in the teaching faculty, and out of these 47 posts are filled on regular basis, 08 on contract and the remaining 21 posts are lying vacant in various subjects. Two Associate Professors are on secondment basis with H.P. Technical University, Hamirpur. In the non-teaching staff, the college has 46 sanctioned posts and out of which 28 are filled up on regular basis and 18 are lying vacant in various categories. One peon is on daily wages basis.

The Self-Finance Courses consist of 20 teaching staff members and 14 non-teaching staff members.

STRENGTH

The total student's strength of the College is 5226 out of which 2844 are girls and 2382 are boys.

IQAC

As per the requirement of NAAC, the college has a functional IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell). Under the aegis of the cell all the developmental activities of the college with respect to teaching, research, inter-institutional collaboration, infrastructure etc. are planned and implemented. Record of all the activities related to students and teachers is maintained by the cell and report thereof sent to NAAC, Bengaluru from time to time. A proper committee is constituted to assure developmental activities under this cell.

LIBRARY

(Librarian : Smt. Anjana Dharwal)

The college has a spacious and magnificent library which is completely computerized and it has a total number of 62154 books on its shelves on various subjects. 693 more books were added in text section; 223 in general section and 161 books were received in the donated books section. In the current session, 24 magazines, 09 Journals and 12 different newspapers in Hindi and English languages are subscribed for the students. The Reprographic section replaced the worn out photocopier machine. 50 new chairs; 1 computer; and 20 wall posters were added to the library. Through software facility INFLIBNET more than 75000 e-journals and books can be accessed. Digital cataloguing of General section is complete. Some rare books were identified and steps were taken to preserve them. More than 200 students visit the library daily. The library of the college organized World Book Day in April, 2016 and the attraction of the day was "Book Exhibition" which was attended by hundreds of students. The college library attracts students aspiring for various competitive exams and this library contributes maximum to their success.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator : Dr. Arvind Kumar)

The college started BCA course from the session 2010 under self-financing scheme and forty students are admitted in this course in every session through written competitive exam followed by an interview. Out of 40 seats, thirty seats are under subsidized category and ten seats are under non-subsidized category. The course has added a new chapter in the achievement of the institution. The Department has excelled in all activities and it is a matter of great pride that in the current session, 3 students of BCA 3rd years got selected in an IT company TCS and 1 student got selected in Wipro technologies. In this session 3 students of BCA 3rd year got selected in HPU, 2 in Punjab University MCA course and 4 were selected in Central University of Himachal Pradesh in M.Sc. (I.T.). Suraj Kumar of BCA 3rd Sem. got first prize in the National Level declamation contest organized by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University Katra, in which 40 students from 8 states of North India had participated. Suraj also got first position in the state level competition held at Gaiety Theater Shimla. The mission of this course remains to develop the personality of the students and make them capable to be selected in higher course in good universities as well as be selected in good IT companies.

MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator : Dr. Parmod S. Patial)

The College started Master of Computer Application (MCA) w.e.f. session 2012 under the School of Computer Science. It is three Year degree course spread over six semesters and is affiliated to H.P. University Shimla and HPTU Hamirpur, approved by AICTE and UGC. The admission to the course is made on the basis of Entrance test conducted by H.P. University Shimla and HPTU Hamirpur. The department has requisite number of lecture halls and well equipped computer laboratories with AC facility.

Over the years, the College has enjoyed a number of partnerships with a variety of corporate entities. Throughout the year, students have the opportunity to learn about, meet and network with these companies. Our students and faculty benefit from these exchanges by understanding practical issues of engineering, while communicating their research interests with our industry partners. Thus, to facilitate this aspiration of the student we at Govt. PG College Dharamshala have a full-fledged Training and Placement Cell, which works towards the fulfillment of the student's aspiration of a suitable job. The cell has been working towards this aspiration of the students and in the recent past, the cell has been able to hold

campuses, joint campuses and off campuses for the students. The strategy of the placement cell has been to invite companies not only for the good students but for the average students also. Companies like Bebo Technologies, Wipro Technologies, Srijan Technologies, ICS System Private Ltd., Tata Consultancy Services, PIC N FRAME etc. have been kind enough to provide placement to our students. More than 80% of the students are placed in MNC's. Fourteen students of MCA sixth semester were placed in Wipro Technologies through campus placement.

POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION (Coordinator : Dr. Mohinder Paul)

The first batch of PGDCA was started in the session 2007-08 with 40 (+1 Single Girl Child) seats. There are total 40 seats for students, aspiring for this course. Out of 40, 30 seats are in the category of subsidized and remaining 10 seats are under non-subsidized category. The admission for PGDCA is done on the basis of merit list. The department has highly modernized computer lab having 55 multimedia PC with broadband connectivity, projector and separate class rooms. The department provides extra facilities to the students regarding

“PHP, MYSQL” for improving their skills in IT field without charging any fee. In current session 40 students are enrolled in this PGDCA course. During the session 2016-17 Miss Manisha Kumari got 3rd position in HPU. The students of this department got placements in various Public and Private Sectors. The mission of this course remains to develop the personality and talent of the students and make them capable for skilled work and responsible citizens of society in this modern age of information technology.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

(Coordinator : Dr. Ajay Katoch)

BBA course was started in the college in 1997 and since then the students of BBA have been securing merit positions among the University toppers. There are 59, 58 and 48 students in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of BBA respectively. Dept. has organized the events like B-Forum, EXCELSIOR, Collage making in the current session to enhance the various management skills and creativity among the students. Seminars on Personality Development, time management and job avenue were orgnaized by the BBA Dept.

The students of BBA 2nd Semester made Industrial tour to TVS Manufacturing Plant (Chandigarh) and students of BBA 4th Semester were on the educational tour in the month of January, where they visited industries (City Aluminium Manufacturing Co. at Goa) to get exposure of the practical work environment.

Inter Semester Declamation, Quiz, and Extempore competitions were organized to inculcate creativity in the students and many students actively performed in social activities i.e. Blood Donation Camp, NSS, Tree Plantation, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan etc.

MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

(Co-ordinator : Dr. Madan Guleria)

The Department of MBA has shown its presence in the University as a student from the IInd Semester Ms. Kanika Gupta bagged Ist position in the University. Three more students Shivangi Rana, Ritika, Diksha Sharma and Parikalpana Dhiman bagged 4th & 7th positions in the university merit list. Besides the students from 4th Semester have also bagged 7th, 8th & 10th positions in the Merit List in the examination held in June 2017 in the university throughout Himachal Pradesh.

The journey of new session commenced with a bang as Department of MBA organized 6

days Induction Orientation Programme, in which speakers from different areas shared their views with the students of the department.

Department organized various seminars on burning topics from time to time in which speakers from the Corporate groups like Economic times, Business Standard, SEBI shared their valuable thoughts on the mentioned topics with the students.

Activities like Quiz Competition, Blood Donation Camp, Swachta Abhiyan, Smart City, Tree Plantation, Cleanliness campaign, Wissenaire' 16- Techno- Management Fest, National Unity Day, Cashless Transactions, Awareness Campaigning against AIDS and Drug Addiction, Awareness Campaign on Road Safety and seminar on Personality Development and Communication Skills were organized in the Department in order to develop the creativity skills of students. Students also participated in the grand finale of North Quiz Competition organized by Economic Times.

Industrial exposure is also an aspect of the MBA Programme. In order to give Industrial exposure to the MBA Students, 2 Day Industrial visit was organized to Verka Milk Plant, Tribune Chandigarh, Buttico Weavers Kullu, Hari Industries, Sundernagar, Coca Cola Pvt. Ltd. Goa, where students minutely observed the working environment of the production plants.

In order to give opportunity to the students to fulfill the requirement of the corporate world special emphasis is given on the Placements of the students in the Department. Department is planning to have a collaborative Placement Drive with different organizations in which students will get a chance to fulfill the requirements of the Corporate World and the process has already been initiated, 55% of the students of Final Semester were placed in various organizations and are fulfilling the requirements of the Corporate World.

DEPARTMENT OF BIO-TECHNOLOGY

(Coordinator : Dr. Savita Singh)

The students of Biotechnology brought laurels to the college by securing top positions in the University merit list. Sonal Karl bagged first position., Anurag Dhiman bagged fourth position, Savita Kumari bagged fifth position and Abhilasha Thakur bagged sixth position. The other important achievements of the Department is the establishment of Biotechnology Lab and renovation of classrooms.

Students visited Forensic Science Laboratory for an update on latest scientific information and knowledge. Dr. Meenakshi Deputy Director Forensic Science shared her thoughts on the scope of subject and motivated them to join training programmer conducted by the Institute.

The Department organized a talk on Xenobiotics by Dr. S.S. Kanwar Chairman of Department of Biotechnology H.P.U. Shimla which benefited the students.

Six Students took Training for 15 days in IHBT, Palampur to learn latest techniques in Molecular Biology.

Quiz contest and weekly seminars were conducted throughout the year.

The students participated in slogan writing and poster making competition on Thalassemia awareness day. Students bagged second position in poster making competition. They also bagged second position in Folk dance in CSCA function.

ENVIRONMENT AND DISASTER MANAGEMENT

The add on course in Environmental and Disaster Management is running successfully from 2012 to till date. The students enrolled in the session 2016-17 were 16, 11 and 3 for certificate course, Diploma course and advanced diploma course respectively. 26 students got first division out of which 11 passed with distinction.

INDIRA GANDHI NATIONAL OPEN UNIVERSITY

IGNOU study centre (1105) has the privilege to be considered as one of the biggest study centre of Himachal Pradesh and was started in the college in 1989. The centre caters to the needs of the students of six districts of Himachal Pradesh because there are some special courses which are available only at this study centre. The study centre has 2 full time non teaching staff members and 3 more non teaching staff members attached to assist for the smooth functioning. The centre has a highly qualified staff of counsellors.

This study centre is offering various courses to students in arts, commerce and science. There is ten percent increase in the admissions every year.

Thus, it is evident that the learner strength is increasing every six months.

Two Induction meetings were held in this year in the months of August 2015 and February 2016 respectively. For the August Induction meeting Regional Director Dr. Poonam Singh was present who not only updated the learners about IGNOU but also was highly appreciative of the centre. The result of this centre is invariably better than the result of State Universities.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

In August 2015, a full-fledged Training & Development Department was set up at our college. This was the first initiative of its kind in government educational institutions of Himachal Pradesh. It was part of the long-term plan of the NAAC Accredited Grade 'A' College to strengthen its delivery mechanism for making its students employable.

The objective of this department is, inter alia, to train students, enrolled in various self-financing programmes of the College, for successfully facing job-placement interviews. Also, the department endeavours to conduct on-campus skill training to keep our students abreast of the latest developments in their respective areas of specialization. Finally, the department attempts to liaise with industry to generate employment for our students. For all students of the College, it also serves as a one-stop point for career guidance and counseling

Till date, 13 students of our MCA department have been successfully placed in Wipro Technologies Ltd in our first on-campus placement drive. Furthermore, 4 BCA and 3 BSc (Maths) students have been placed in Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), as of now. Another 35 students of BCA have been shortlisted for Wipro Technologies upcoming placement drive. The students of our College have participated in online efforts and in data collection drives for Smart City Dharamshala initiative as part of our Corporate Social Responsibility and Community participation Drive. Efforts are on to bring more employers for a productive interface with our IT and Management students.

COLLEGE HOSTELS:

(Wardens : Prof. Dhyan Singh & Prof. Vishvajyoti)

The college has provided two hostels for girls. Hostels are categorized as general girls' hostel and tribal girls' hostel. There are 51 girls residing in Tribal hostel and 42 in General hostel. Madhu Bala and Nidhi Pathania were the hostel prefects of tribal and general hostel respectively. During the session, the work for the construction of supplementary hostel accommodation in general hostel has been completed and Hon'ble CM inaugurated the hostel in January, 2017 and it will start functioning very soon. The new building has 9 well furnished rooms in which 25 girls can be accommodated. Renovation of old building of general hostel for which Hon'ble Minister sanctioned five lakhs has also been completed. To ensure the safety of the building, adequate fire extinguishers have been installed in both the hostels. From time to time to welcome and enable the students to know each other fresher's parties are organized and in the same way to bid adieu farewell parties are organized. To keep

the eatables fresh, the provision of refrigerator is also provided to the inhabitants. Installation of Wi-fi connection in both the hostel's is on progress and will start functioning very soon. Boys hostel is also functioning very well and has provided accommodation to 46 boys. Hostel prefect was Vivek Kapoor.

Organization of National Mathematics Day on 22nd Dec. 2016 (Organiser : Department of Maths)

The department of Mathematics organised various completions, such as Quiz contest, debate and lectures on various topics, on 22nd Dec. 2016 in the College Paryas Hall to commemorate the birth anniversary of great mathematician Sir Srinivasa Ramanujan and celebrated the day as National Mathematics Day.

Asst./ Associate Profs. in mathematics from various colleges of Distt. Kangra (H.P.) were invited and in particular the teachers in mathematics from PSR Govt. College Baijnath, SCVB Govt. College Palampur, Govt. College Shahpur, Govt. College Dehri and University of Horticulture & Forestry Nouni, Study Central at Hamirpur delivered lectures on various topics on the latest trends in maths including the life of Sir Srinivasa Ramanujan.

STAFF

The college has a total number of 75 sanctioned posts in the teaching faculty, and out of these 44 posts are filled on regular basis, 16 on contract and the remaining 15 posts are lying vacant in various subjects. In the non-teaching staff, the college has 44 sanctioned posts and out of which 25 are filled up on regular basis, 1 on contract and 18 are lying vacant in various categories. One peon is on daily wages basis.

IQAC

LIBRARY

The college has a spacious and magnificent library which is completely computerized and it has a total number of 62311 books on its shelves on various subjects. In the current session, 24 magazines, 09 Journals and 12 different newspapers in Hindi and English languages are subscribed for the students. Through software facility INFLIBNET more than 75000 e-journals and books can be accessed. Digital cataloguing of general section is complete. BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator: Prof. Nikesh Sharma)

The college started BCA course from the session 2010 under self-financing scheme and forty students are admitted in this course in every session through written competitive exam followed by an interview. From the session 2018 onwards, Himachal University has increased our seats from 40 to 60. Out of 60 seats, forty seats are under subsidized category and twenty seats are under non-subsidized category. The course has added a new chapter in the achievement of the institution. Suraj Kumar, student of BCA 6th semester got first prize in declamation contest held at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University and was awarded by Hon'ble Governor and Education Minister J & K. He also received the Jury award for National Youth Parliament festival and the guests were Hon'ble Prime Minister and Sports Minister. In the current session, 2 students of BCA 6th semester already got selected in Wipro Technology as well as Infosys through off Campus placement. The Dept. also organized various seminars on the current developments in the fields of Information Technology and also on general topics like "Natural Disasters" etc. In this session 18 new Computers have been installed in the computer lab. The mission of this course remains to develop the personality of the students and make them capable to be selected in higher courses in good universities.

MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator: Dr. Sanjay Pathania)

Master of Computer Applications is a post-graduate program of Govt. P.G. College Dharamshala. The program started from the year 2012. It is a three-year program spread over six semesters to bridge the chasm between computer studies and applications bringing within reach of enthusiastic youngsters by an excellent group of experienced and dedicated staff, and an enviable infrastructure. MCA department strives to shape outstanding computer professionals with ethical and human values to reshape nation's destiny. The department aims to provide an excellent learning opportunity for all students and staff to develop knowledge and skills essential in enlightening the individual's ability to think vitally and utilize information technology to meet the technological challenges of tomorrow and to refine knowledge and understanding through research and creativity. Department organized one month “ICT Internship Course” for eight selected students in “Web Designing & Development” at “ICAI Computer Enhancement Institute Mohali”.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (Coordinator: Dr. Manjit Singh)

BBA course was started in the college in 1997 and since then the students of BBA have been securing merit positions among the University toppers. There are 59, 57 and 57 students in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of BBA respectively. CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

Incharge: Dr. Naresh Sharma

In August 2015, a full-fledged Training & Development Department was set up at our college. This was the first initiative of its kind in government educational institutions of Himachal Pradesh. It was part of the long-term plan of the NAAC Accredited Grade 'A' College to strengthen its delivery mechanism for making its students employable.

The objective of this department is, inter alia, to train students, enrolled in various self-financing programmes of the College, for successfully facing job-placement interviews. Also, the department endeavours to conduct on-campus skill training to keep our students abreast of the latest developments in their respective areas of specialization. Finally, the department attempts to liaise with industry to generate employment for our students. For all students of the college, it also serves as a one-stop point for career guidance and counseling

COLLEGE HOSTELS:

(Wardens: Prof. Dhyan Singh & Prof. Vishvajyoti)

The College has provided two hostels for girls. Hostels are categorized as general girls' hostel and tribal girls' hostel. There were 51 girls residing in tribal hostel and 42 in general hostel in 2017 session but as the inauguration of supplementary building has been done, the rooms were allotted to candidates in 2018 as per the availability of the furniture. Thereafter

in 2018, there are 52 girls residing in tribal hostel and 67 in general hostel. Manisha and Isha were the hostel prefects of tribal and general hostel respectively of 2017-18 session and Vishaka and Bandna Pathania are the hostel prefects of the tribal and general hostel respectively of 2018-19 session. During the session 2018, renovation of roof and some rooms of old building of general hostel was also completed. Renovation of roof and whitewashing of interior of Tribal girls' hostel has also taken place during the session. Water cooler has also been installed in the supplementary building of General Girls Hostel. To ensure the safety of the hostel inmates CCTV cameras were installed in both the hostels. Vending machines have also been installed in both the hostels. Further, One of the girls of tribal hostel namely Anamika distinctly participated in fencing competition and brought laurels to the college. From time to time to welcome and enable the students to know each other fresher's parties are organized and in the same way to bid adieu farewell parties are organized. To keep the eatables fresh, the provision of refrigerator is also provided to the inmates. Installation of Wi-Fi connection in both the hostels' is on progress and will start functioning very soon.

BOYS HOSTEL

There are total 27 rooms in the Tribal Boys hostel which include one guest room, one room for cook-cum-caretaker, one common room and one is used as a storeroom. The total capacity of boys hostel is 46 students. At present there are 45 energetic and aspiring students residing in the hostel. There is one aqua guard for water purification and one water cooler installed in the mess of the hostel. The common room is fully equipped with 32-inch led television and Stag table tennis. Almost all the sports articles are provided to the inmates of the hostel.

The hostel has a prefect, Mr. Pradeep Singh, and three floor representatives namely Vishavjit, Vinod and Aman and one mess in charge Jaram Singh. They all assist the hostel warden and discipline committee in taking care of the discipline and running the hostel successfully. During the past two years eight students (Mridul Jaryal, Sachin, Nikhil, Vicky, Mukesh and Kishore) have been selected in Army, Paramilitary forces and other significant departments. Every year several study circles and famous national and regional days are observed and celebrated to provide exposure to the students. Currently the hostel has one cook, one mess helper and one sweeper. The hostel subscribes two newspapers, both in Hindi and English, and two monthly competitive magazines regularly to its hostel inmates.

DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

Disaster Management

Disaster Management can be defined as the organization and management of resources and responsibilities for dealing with all humanitarian aspects of emergencies, in particular preparedness, response and recovery in order to lessen the impact of disasters.

The first people to respond to a disaster are those living in the local community. They are the first to start rescue and relief operations. Therefore focus should be given on community-based disaster preparedness, which assists communities to reduce their vulnerability to disasters and strengthen their capacities to resist them.

The United Nations defines a disaster as a serious disruption of the functioning of a community or as society. Disasters involve widespread human, material, economic or environmental impacts, which exceed the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources.

Types of Disasters

There is no country that is immune from disaster, though vulnerability to disaster varies. There are four main types of disaster.

- **Natural Disasters:** including floods, hurricanes, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions that have immediate impacts on human health and secondary impacts causing further death and suffering from (for example) floods, landslides, fires, tsunamis.
- **Environmental Emergencies:** including technological or industrial accidents, usually involving the production, use or transportation of hazardous material, and occur where these materials are produced, used or transported, and forest fires caused by humans.
- **Complex Emergencies:** involving a break-down of authority, looting and attacks on strategic installations, including conflict situations and war.
- **Pandemic Emergencies:** involving a sudden onset of contagious disease that affects health, disrupts services and businesses, brings economic and social costs.

Any disaster can interrupt essential services, such as health care, electricity, water, sewage/garbage removal, transportation and communication. The interruption can seriously

have a major and long-lasting impact on people long after the immediate effect has been mitigated. Poorly planned relief activities can have a significant negative impact not only on the disaster victims but also on donors and relief agencies. So it is important that physical therapists join established programs rather than attempting individual efforts.

Local, regional, national and international organizations are all involved in mounting a humanitarian response to disasters. Each will have a prepared disaster management plan. These plans cover prevention, preparedness, relief and recovery.

Disaster Prevention

These are activities designed to provide permanent protection from disasters. Not all disasters, particularly natural disasters, can be prevented, but the risk of loss of life and injury can be mitigated with good evacuation plans, environmental planning and design standards. In January 2005, 168 Governments adopted a 10-year global plan for natural disaster risk reduction called the Hyogo Framework. It offers guiding principles, priorities for action, and practical means for achieving disaster resilience for vulnerable communities.

Disaster Preparedness

These activities are designed to minimize the loss of life and damage- for example by removing people and property from a threatened location and by facilitating timely and effective rescue, relief and rehabilitation. Preparedness is the main way of reducing the impact of disasters. Community- based preparedness and management should be a high priority in physical therapy practice management.

Disaster Relief

This is as coordinated multi-agency response to reduce the impact of a disaster and its long-term results. Relief activities include rescue, relocation, providing food and water, preventing disease and disability, repairing vital service such as telecommunications and transport, providing temporary shelter and emergency health care.

Disaster Recovery

Once emergency needs have been met and the initial crisis is over, the people affected and the communities that support them are still vulnerable. Recovery activities include rebuilding infrastructure. These should blend with development activities, such as building human resources for health and developing policies and practices to avoid similar situations in future.

Disaster management is linked with sustainable development, particularly in relation to vulnerable people such as those with disabilities, elderly people, children and other marginalized groups.

In view of the above, Geography Department of Govt. College Dharamshala organized one day training/mock drill program on disaster management for students in collaboration with Disaster Management Cell in the office of Deputy Commissioner, Kangra at Dharamshala on

19th March 2019 in college auditorium. Around 500 students of the college attended this training/mock drill and get benefitted from it.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The students of the department of psychology attended a special training on “Drug –de-addiction” at “Gunjan” Dharamshala, organized by ministry of social justice and empowerment from 25th feb. 2019 to 11th March 2019.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

The department organized a workshop on the “Principles of Physics” in collaboration with central university of Himachal Pradesh. Prof. M.G. Tarenekar from Calcutta university demonstrated the basic principles of physics for the students of the physics department and workshop ended as an eye- opener to the students. Besides, the department also organized a lecture on the topic “Three quantum Indians” in which Prof. P.K. Ahluwalia retired as Dean H.P. University presented his valuable views on the topic. This lecture was also organized in collaboration with the central university of Himachal Pradesh.

Workshop on substance Abuse Problem:

One day workshop programme (27-03-2019) organised on prevention of substance abuse problem at Government College Dharamshala sponsored by National Institute of Social Defence, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, organised by Dr. Amit Katoch (Tour & Travel) and Dr. Hemant Sharma (Music) under the able guidance of Principal Government College Prof. Sunil Kumar Mehta. The event was organised through National Service Scheme of Central University of Himachal Pradesh. Prof. Sunil Kumar Mehta inaugurated this event and motivated students by their remarks. The objective of this program was to impart training and learning in prevention of substance abuse.

Dr. Anita Thakur form zonal hospital Dharamshala said that this program aims to alert students about the various services available for dealing rehabilitation and prevention of drug abuse through various methods. Dr. Aditi Sharma form Central University of Himachal Pradesh, also delivered her views on the topic reduction of substance abuse and imparted skills to participants that how could they deal with drug and alcohol abuse. Dr. Amit Katoch (Tour & Travel, Head of Department Assistant Professor) and Dr. Hemant Sharma (Assistant Professor from Music Department) of Government College, Dharamshala acted as convener of the program. A total of more than 180 participants that is students participated in the said event.

Located at the foothills of majestic Dhauladhar, Govt. PG College Dharamshala, one of the oldest institutions of Himachal has a great history of achievements. The foundation stone of the College was laid in 1912. It was elevated to the level of intermediate College in 1926. The College started bringing fourth graduates from 1947. The College was the first institution to introduce post-graduation in different streams. The Journey of evolution, growth and excellence is still on. There are 40 new books added to the textbook section resulting in 16966 text books in all. In general books section the total books are 46372 as there was no addition. In the current session 12 newspapers in English and Hindi are subscribed for the students, the esteemed newspaper “The Hindu” is also included. The Library of self-financing courses is fully automated. The General library is also going to be completely automated in the coming days.

SELF FINANCING DEPARTMENTS

Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA): Coordinator Dr.RaghubirBarsola

The college started the BCA course from the session 2010 under a self-financing scheme and 60 students were admitted in this course in every session through entrance exam. But due to covid-19, the students were admitted on the basis of 12th marks.

Out of 60 seats, 40 seats under subsidized category and 20 seats are under non subsidised category. The course has added a new chapter in the achievement of the institution the department has excelled in all activities and it is a matter of great Pride that in the current session two students of BCA 6th semester (Priyanshu Kumar Bhatti and RajatThapa) got selected for final round in Wipro Technologies. In this session 3 students of BCA 6th semester got selected in CUHP for MCA and some of the others are under admission process in Punjab University/HP Shimla/etc. accepted for higher studies. During the session, the department has conducted an online seminar under Enlightened India foundation's ‘mind skillz’ for BCA 4th semester. In the session students have learned various latest IT trends and

coding skills in different platforms. The mission of the discourse remains to develop the personality of the students and make them capable to be selected in higher courses in good universities as well as to be selected in good IT companies.

MCA Coordinator Dr V.S Vats

Master of Computer Applications was started in the college from the session 2012. MCA department is well equipped computer labs, new furniture, and writing boards and requisite number of lecture halls. It is a three –year program spread over six semesters to bridge the chasm between computer studies and applications bringing within reach of enthusiastic youngsters by excellent youngsters by an excellent group of experienced and dedicated staff, and an enviable infrastructure.
