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Government Post Graduate College Dharamshala - An Introduction

Sharing its boundary with International Cricket Stadium, having a clear view of majestic Dhauladhars and dark rain-rich Monsoon clouds, gurgling streams and towering White Mountains, Government Post Graduate College, Dharamshala, the college of excellence, carries a long magnificent history of its own and the institution is now ninety years old. The foundation stone of the college was laid by Sir Louis Dane, the then Lt. Governor of Punjab on 4th May, 1912. It is the first college in the state to introduce the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce and also Post Graduation in different subjects. The college is also accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangluru (NAAC). The collective efforts of teaching and non-teaching staff have already brought splendid and brilliant results and the roots of the college are spread throughout the country. The college has sanctioned strength of 97 teachers and 45 non-teaching staff.

Library is an integral part of any educational institution. The library of the college is fully computerized, spacious and largest in the state with a total number of 56911 books in its shelves. The College Library has been "N-List" under INFLEBNET whereby students can have online access to books and journals. To compete with the changing educational needs, self financing and professional courses BBA, PGDCA and BCA were also introduced in 1997, 2007 and 2010 respectively. Besides, six career oriented add-on courses are also offered to students which they can opt as additional courses. The college offers 21 subjects to the students for choice in their graduation which also includes Elective English, Elective Hindi and Elective Sanskrit. The subjects like Geology, Commercial Art, Painting, Psychology, Philosophy are the major attractions as these are offered only by this prestigious institution of the state. The college also offers two vocational courses i.e. Computer Application & Tourism and Travels for which admission is made on merit basis. The college has the honour of being given Star College Project by the Department of Bio-Technology, Govt. of India w.e.f. 2010-13. The college has an IGNOU Study Centre which caters to the needs of the students from various districts of the state and Study Centre offers more than 25 courses in various disciplines.

The Career Guidance Cell of the college remains active throughout the session and arranges various counselling lectures for students to make them aware of the vistas open to them in this modern competitive world. The college has four modern Computer Labs with more than 200 computers and students have the privilege to avail internet facility with broad-band connection. The college has constituted various clubs and societies like Drama club, Eco Club, Mountaineering and Trekking club, Yoga and Fitness Club, Disaster Management Club, B-Speak Club, Planning Forum, Cultural Society, Literary Society, Commerce Society etc. which provide platform to the students who have a knack for doing something exceptional, extra-ordinary and adventurous. The College has not only excelled in academic activities but has also distinguished itself in sports and cultural activities as well. The sportspersons of the college have brought laurels not only at state or national level but also at international level.

The college has separate NCC units for boys and girls and three units of National Service Scheme (NSS) and one unit of Rovers and Rangers. In order to spread AIDS awareness, the college is running Red-Ribbon Club. The college has three hostels, one for boys and two for girls and these hostels provide accommodation to 50 boys and 100 girls. The Parent-Teachers Association is an integral part of the college and it always comes forward to assist the college administration to take up various developmental activities in the college. Old Students Association is playing a pivotal role in the growth of the college.

RESERVATION : (COMMON FOR BIOTECH, BBA, BCA & PGDCA)

Admission to the course except for seats reserved for NRI's/NRI sponsored and foreign students shall be subject to the following conditions :

- a) 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education, or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. However, reservation of seats will be governed by notification of the Government from time to time.

The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under :-

- i. 25% of the seats for admission to the course shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from which they have passed their qualifying examination.
- ii. 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. subject to the following reservation.
 - a) 5% of all seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen.
 - b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding cultural activists.
 - c) 3% of the seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.
 - d) Provided that the minimum eligibility for admission to the course in case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility conditions for other candidates.

Note : 120 point's roster of H.P. University showing reservations of various categories for admissions shall be followed.

COURSES, ELIGIBILITY AND AGE LIMIT

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA)

(A) Course :

Apart from Dept. of Computer Science, HPU Shimla, Govt. P.G. College Dharamshala has also started BCA course from the academic session 2010-2011. BCA is the three year Degree Course having semester system of examination w.e.f. 2014. The total number of seats in BCA course is 60 from session 2018-19. The distribution of Seats is as under :

(B) Eligibility Conditions

- (a) Plus two examination in any discipline under 10+2 system or any other examination equivalent thereto, of Board/University established by law in India with at least 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST candidates).
- (b) Any examination of a Board/University/ College/School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility as laid down by the Vice Chancellor/Equivalence Committee or on

the recommendation of Association of Indian Universities, AIU House, 16 Kotla Marg, New Delhi-110002, with at least 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST candidates).

(C) Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girls candidates, as on the 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxaton up to maximum of three months.

BASIS OF ADMISSION:

SCHEME-I (Subsidized Seats)

There shall be an entrance examination for candidates seeking admission to BCA course. The Selection process comprises of two stages viz. Written Test of 80 marks and Academic Weightage of 20 marks. The Merit will be drawn out of 100 marks.

The written test contains questions on Quantitative Aptitude, General English and General Knowledge and Computer Awareness. The Academic weightage of 20 marks spread as under :-

10% of marks percentage obtained in matriculation exam and 10% of marks percentage obtained in +2 examination.

Note : Rechecking / Re-Evaluation of answer sheets of Entrance Examination shall not be allowed.

SCHEME -II FOR BCA NON-SUBSIDISED SEATS

In addition to the eligibility conditions mentioned above (under Scheme I), NRIs/ NRI Sponsored/Foreign nationals shall be required to submit along with the application form, the following documents as may be applicable for category of their candidature.

- A. Proof of Nationality in case of Foreign Nationals.
- B. Proof of their status in the case of NRI's. For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proof.
 - (i) Copy of Non resident card/Employment card issued by the employer
 - (ii) Photocopy of the immigration card/employment VISA entry on the passport alongwith details of the passport.
 - (iii) Certificate issued by the IndianEmbassy/High Commission in the country where NRI is residing.
- C. Certificate of sponsorship from NRI in the case of a sponsored candidate, alongwith proof of NRI status of the sponsorer required under para (B).
- D. Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the Income-tax authorities in India and the Permanent Account Number (PAN) of the sponsorer issued by the Income Tax Department.
- E. Two self addressed envelopes of size 28×13 cm bearing stamps for Rs. 6 or in the case of Foreign addressee stamps of required amount should be affixed by the applicant.

BIO-TECHNOLOGY

Details of Course and Scheme of Examination

- I. The B.Sc. (Honours) Biotechnology will be of three years duration, Choice Based Credit System [CBCS] course.
- II. There will be broadly three types of courses for B.Sc. (Honours) Biotechnology degree program.

1. The **Core Courses** (14 courses for Honours; and 4 discipline specific papers +4 GE) will be of 6-credits each including 2 credits assigned to the practical component. Thus a candidate will have to pass 14 courses for earning $14 \times 6 = 84$ credits during six semesters. Each of the 6-credits courses will carry 100 marks. These 100 marks will be split into marks assigned for Theory [TH]: 50 marks; Practical [PR]: 20 marks and Internal Assessment [IA]: 30. The Internal Assessment [20 marks] will include one Multi Choice Questions (MCQ)-based examination of 15 marks [15 or 30 questions of 1.0 or 0.5 mark each as the case may be]; and Classroom Attendance Incentive marks (5 marks). The Lab-based practical will be of 2-hours [One credit]. A total of $14 \times 6 = 84$ credits could be accumulated under these courses during the Honours degree program.
2. The **Elective Courses** will be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/ subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency / skill. The Elective Courses will include:

Discipline Specific Elective [DSE] Courses: A total of 4 courses offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. These courses are discipline related and/ or interdisciplinary in nature. A total of $4 \times 6 = 24$ credits could be accumulated under DSE courses during the Honours degree program.

Generic Elective [GE] Courses: A total of 4 courses of 6-credits each including 2 credits assigned for the practical component of each of these courses i.e. two courses per year from 1st to 2nd year will be studied by the candidates. An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/ subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline(s) of choice is called Generic Elective Course.

The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. Further, a course offered in a discipline/ subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective Course. A total of $4 \times 6 = 24$ credits could be accumulated under GE courses during the Honours degree program.

3. **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses [AECC]:** Ability Enhancement Courses are of two types; Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses [AECC] and Skill Enhancement Courses [SEC]. A total of $4 \times 4 = 16$ credits could be accumulated under these courses during the Honours degree program i.e. $4 \times 2 = 8$ credits for AECC, and $4 \times 2 = 8$ credits for SEC courses.

The AECC courses are the mandatory courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement;

- i. Environment Science and
- ii. English/ Hindi/ MIL Communication. All these are mandatory courses for obtaining a B.Sc. (Honours) degree in the concerned subject. These courses are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/ or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills etc. A minimum of two such courses for obtaining an Honours degree are selected amongst the courses designed to provide value-based and/ or skill based knowledge and may contain both theory and lab/ hands-on training. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.
- iii. **Practical [PR]** component has been included in every core and discipline/ generic specific elective paper. The list of practicals to be conducted by the candidates has been provided alongside each of such courses. The marks (30 marks) for the practical examination will be split as follows:

Write up of Practical I:	5 marks
Write up of Practical II:	5 marks
Performance of any one of above practicals:	7 marks
Practical record/ notebook:	5 marks
Viva voce:	8 marks

- IV. **Classroom Attendance Incentive:** Those candidates who have greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CAI marks as follows:

- V. The candidate has to secure minimum pass marks individually in Theory paper, Practical as well as Internal Assessment to earn full credits in the concerned course. A candidate thus failing in any of these components shall be consider failed in that course.
- VI. **Eligibility.** The admission to B.Sc. (Honours) Biotechnology programme of Himachal Pradesh University will be as per guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time.
- The candidate should have passed 10+2 (class XII) Examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board/ University with any of the three subjects out of Physics, Chemistry and Biology or any other science subject with 50% or equivalent grade (for SC/ ST candidates marks of eligibility will be 45% or equivalent grade).
 - In case of candidates who are studying in University/Board/College/Schools in any of the foreign countries the eligibility/Qualifying marks will be the same as recognized/equivalent to 10+2 by the University or the association of the Indian University with 50% marks of equivalent grade (for SC/ ST candidates, eligibility will be 45% marks or equivalent grade).
 - The candidate who has appeared in the qualifying examination but whose result has so far not been declared can also apply but his/her eligibility for the entrance test will be purely provisional subject to the condition that he/

she has to produce a passing certificate scoring at least the minimum percentage of marks as prescribed for the qualifying examination on the day and the specified time of counseling. The candidate shall not be more than 22 years of age as on 01st July of the year of admission. Date of birth as recorded in the Secondary Education Board/ University Certificate Only will be considered as authenticated.

4. Age Limit :

The candidate shall not be more than 22 years of age as on 01st July of the year of admission. Date of birth as recorded in the Secondary Education Board / University Certificate only will be considered as authenticated.

5. BASIS OF ADMISSION:

1. Admission will be based on the merit / or the entrance test to be conducted by HP University or any other mode as to be decided by the University from time to time.
2. The tuition fee and other monthly / annual charges will be as per University rules.
3. Paper for entrance test will be of 50 marks comprising of multiple choice questions from Physics, Chemistry, Maths, Biology & Biochemistry.

Seats, Eligibility Conditions, Basis of Admission

Bachelor of Business Administration Programme was introduced by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla in the University College of business studies with the objectives of training and meeting man power requirements for junior management positions.

On the same pattern we are offering the programme at your door step.

The duration of BBA is three years spread over six semesters. There shall be university examination at the end of each semester.

The total numbers of seats in BBA course are 60, distributes as under : Subsidised candidates : 40 seats, NRI/NRI sponsored candidates / foreign candidates/ Non-subsidised : 20 seats.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS :

Plus two examination under 10+2 system or examination equivalent there of to a Board / University established by law in India with 45% marks (40% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe)

Or

Any examination of University / Board / College or school in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice Chancellor / Equivalence Committee of its own or on recommendation of Association of Indian Universities AIU House, 16 Kalla Marg, New Delhi 110002 with 45% marks. (40% marks in case of Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe).

BASIS OF ADMISSION:

There shall be an admission test for candidates seeking admission to BBA course. Admission to BBA comprises of four stages i.e. application rating, written test (consisting of General English, General Mathematics, General Knowledge and General Management), Group Discussion and Interview. The weightage assigned in computing merit is as follows :

1. APPLICATION RATING :

20 marks (10 marks each for matric and plus two examination level on the basis of percentage scored in the examination while computing merit a candidate having commerce or mathematics as a subject at plus two level will be given additional weightage of ten percent of

aggregate marks obtained by him/her in plus two examination :

2. **Written Test** : 60 marks (Comprising of four parts Gen. English, Gen. Mathematics, General Awareness and Management aptitude. 30 questions each.)
3. **Group Discussion** : 10 marks
4. **Interview** : 10 marks

The written test is an instrument for screening the candidates for group discussion & interview. Normally, three candidates for each seat will be called on the basis of written test for further selection.

PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION :

1. Separate merit lists shall be prepared for subsidised and for non-subsidised category.
2. The college reserves the right to fill any vacant seat(s) in the self financing category on the bases of academic performance of the candidates in the past examinations. If insufficient number of students do not qualify for the admission on the basis of competitive examination, merit will be computed on the basis of matric and 10+2 or equivalent examination having equal weightage, where as candidates having Commerce or Mathematics as a subject at +2 level will be given additional weightage of 10% of aggregate marks obtained by him / her in 10+2 or equivalent examination. Only eligible candidates depending upon the number of vacant seats shall be admitted to the programme either Bonafide Himachali or student in HP.

RESERVATION AND AGE LIMIT

Reservation

Admission to the course except for seats reserved for NRI's/NRI sponsored and foreign students shall be subject to the following conditions :

a) 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education, or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. However reservation of seats will be governed by notification of the Govt. from time to time.

The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under :-

- i. 25% of the seats for admission to the course shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from which they have passed their qualifying examination.
- ii. 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh affiliated to any other Education Board e.g. CBSE or ICSE Board etc. subject to the following reservation.
 - a) 5% of all seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen.
 - b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for the outstanding cultural activists.

- c) 3% of the seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.
- d) The minimum eligibility for admission to the course in case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility conditions for other candidates.
- e) 120 points roster of H.P. University showing reservations of various categories for admissions shall be followed.

Age Limit :

Except for NRI/NRI sponsored candidates and Foreign candidates, the maximum age limit for admission to BBA programme is 22 years as on **first of July** of the year concerned, provided that in case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribes, the upper age limit will be **relaxed by three years**.

However, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation upto a maximum period of three months for reason to be recorded in writing.

DRESS CODE A step towards a professional look and personality development.

A formal dress implies cultivation of special attitude and also adds to personality development.

Dress Code for BBA Students will be

CODE OF CONDUCT AND GENERAL RULES

1. The Decision of Principal in all matters will be final and binding.
2. Students must be seated in the classrooms before the start of the lecture. No student shall enter the class or knock the door after 5 (five) minutes of start of the class.

3. No student shall be loitering near the classes once the classes are in progress.
4. Regular attendance in the class including guest lecturers is compulsory.
5. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the college premises. A student using mobile phones in class room / lab will be fined Rs. 500/- and no exemption will be given in any case.
6. Every student will submit assignments, project etc. as per periodic directions.
7. Misbehaviour, Persistence disobedience, habitual late coming, consumption of drug or liquor in the institute, cheating in the examination and any unbecoming act may invite strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the institute.
8. Each student is expected to observe the college dress code strictly.
9. Each student is expected to be present regularly in the college. Name will be struck-off if a candidate absentees himself continuously for six days. Candidates can get re-admission after satisfying the Principal.
10. No student is permitted to undertake any part time / whole time job during the course of study.
11. No student is allowed to put posters in college campus or notice board and to hold assembly in college premises or to address on unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
12. Any student making loss to the college property will be penalized and the students concerned will have to replace or get the same repaired at his / her own cost.
13. Food, breweries and any type of drink are not permitted in the lab / class rooms.
14. Students are not allowed to leave the college campus during teaching hours without prior permission.
15. Parents will be intimated about the progress of their ward periodically through report card and personal feedback.
16. Every student must always carry with him / her duly completed identity card.
17. The boys are directed to have their beard properly trimmed and the girls are also directed to keep their hair in proper order.

ELIGIBILITY FOR PROMOTION

The pass marks in each subject shall be **45% (32 theory +13 Internal assessment)** while appearing in the examination within two available chances. The candidates placed in compartment may be exempted from appearing in paper(s) in which he/she has already obtained required pass marks.

The aggregate marks obtained by the candidate in B.B.A. examination shall be the sum total of the marks obtained by him/her in which he/she has passed.

The successful candidates shall be classified in three Divisions as under :-

- (i) First Division : 60% or more of the aggregate marks.
- (ii) Second Division : 50% or more but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
- (iii) Third Division : less than 50% of the aggregate marks.

A candidate obtaining pass marks in any course shall not be required to re-appear in that course again. However, **the candidate shall be required to complete his/her B.B.A. degree within a maximum period of five years.**

CURBING RAGGING IN THE INSTITUTE

Ragging in institute is strictly banned according to the judgement and directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Himachal Pradesh University and guidelines issued by UGC in this regards. The following guidelines will be observed to prevent incidents of ragging in the institute.

1. Every candidate seeking admission will give undertaking duly printed on the application form that he / she will not indulge in ragging and if found guilty he / she will be liable for punishment. Similar undertaking will be obtained from the parents / guardians of applicant.
2. Anti Ragging committee has been constituted in the college.
3. Whenever a ragging incident is brought to the notice of college authorities, the disciplinary committee will hold an enquiry into the incident.
4. If any student is found guilty of ragging after the enquiry then he / she will be punishable accordingly. The punishment may include :-
 - i) Expulsion from the College
 - ii) Suspension from the classes
 - iii) Fine with a public apology
 - iv) Withholding scholarship or other benefits
 - v) Debarring from the representation in events
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess
 - vii) Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated
5. If any student is found guilty of ragging incident occurred in the past then he/she may be expelled from the institution.

RULES RELATED WITH LEAVE

a) General Leave Rules

- i) Student can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students (@ Rs. 5/- per booklet).
- ii) A maximum of 5 days leave is allowed in a semester. A tutor can recommend leave upto 3 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 5 days, a student must get the application signed by the Coordinator of the programme.
- iii) Leave during House Examination / Class Tests should be avoided, if unavoidable will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Coordinator.
- iv) Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

b) Duty Leave Rules

Participation by the students in sports/ cultural / NSS / NCC / Co-curricular activities, Inter College / University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition. Duty Leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity in charge.

HOUSE EXAMINATION AND LECTURE ATTENDANCE

All the students have to appear in the House Examination which will be conducted in each semester before university examinations. House Examination is a very useful exercise as the students come to know about their short comings. Moreover, House Examination is a rehearsal for the University Examination. Every student has to appear in the House Examination and secure at least 20% marks in each subject or 25% marks in aggregate failing which he/ she will be debarred from appearing in university examination. Moreover a student who fails to show satisfactory result in House Examination shall forfeit his / her claims to fee concession or other financial assistance. The students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in theory and practical separately. The Principal can condone the participated days in every course including practical in respect of students who have to miss classes on account of their participation in NCC/ NSS/ Sports Cultural / Academic / Co-Curricular activities.

RULES FOR COMPUTER LAB

- 1) Lab computers are for academic and research use. Personal e-mailing, chatting and games are not permitted.
- 2) Setting of the computers should not be changed.
- 3) No personal CDs, Pen Drives and Memory Cards are allowed in computer lab.
- 4) Internet facility can be availed with the prior permission of a teacher.
- 5) Accessing prohibited sites may invite penalty or suspension from Lab/ College.

NAME STRUCK OFF AND RE-ADMISSION

In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within 1st seven days with first re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed performa. If the candidate fails to seek re-admission within first seven days then he/she should seek re-admission upto 12 days, on payment of Rs. 200 as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent / guardian. After 12 days from the date of his / her name is struck off, there shall be no re-admission in any case.

If the name of the student is struck off again then 2nd re-admission fee is Rs. 200/- and if the name of the student is struck off 3rd time, there is no provision for readmission in that case.

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CODE OF CONDUCT AND GENERAL RULES

1. The decision of Principal in all matters will be final and binding.
2. Students must be seated in the classrooms before the start of the lecture. No student shall enter the class or knock the door after 5 (Five) minutes of the start of the class.
3. No students shall be loitering near the classes once the classes are in progress.
4. Regular attendance in the class including guest lectures is compulsory.
5. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
6. Every student will submit assignment, project etc. as per periodic directions.
7. Misbehaviour, persistence disobedience, habitual late coming, consumption of drug or liquor in the institute, cheating in the examination and any unbecoming act may invite strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the institute.
8. Each student is expected to observe the college dress code strictly.
9. Each student is expected to be present regularly in the college. Name will be struck-off if a candidate absentees himself continuously for five days. Candidate can seek re-admission after satisfying the Principal.
10. No student is permitted to undertake any part time / whole time job during the courses of study.
11. No student is allowed to put posters in college campus or notice board and to hold assembly in college premises or to address on unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
12. Any student causing loss to the college property will be penalized and the students concerned will have to replace or get the same repaired at his / her own costs.
13. Food, breweries and any type of drink are not permitted in the lab / class rooms.
14. Students are not allowed to leave the college campus during teaching hours without prior permission.
15. Parents will be intimated about the progress of their ward periodically through report card and personal feedback.
16. Every student must always carry with him / her duly completed identity card.

CURBING RAGGING IN THE INSTITUTE:

Ragging in institute is strictly banned according to the judgment and directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Himachal Pradesh University and guidelines issued by UGC in this regards. The following guidelines will be observed to prevent incidents of ragging in the institute.

1. Every candidate seeking admission will give undertaking duly printed on the application form that he /she will not indulge in ragging and if found guilty he/she will be liable for punishment. Similar undertaking will be obtained from the parents / guardian of the applicant.
2. Anti Ragging committees has been constituted in the College.
3. Whenever a ragging incident is brought to the notice of the College authorities, the disciplinary committee will hold an enquiry into the incident.
4. If any student is found guilty of ragging, after the enquiry then he /she will be punished accordingly. The punishment may include :-
 - i) Expulsion from the college
 - ii) Suspension from the classes
 - iii) Fine with a public apology
 - iv) Withholding scholarship or other benefits

- v) Debarring from the representation in events.
- vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess.
- vii) Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated.

5. If any student is found guilty of ragging incident occurred in the past then he /she may be expelled from the institution.

Note : In case of an emergency, the student(s) may contact on Tel. No. 01892-224894, 01892-225394, 01892-222215 and contact any member of the Protocol-cum-Anti-Ragging cum Discipline Committee.

RULES RELATED TO LEAVE

a. General Leave Rules

- i) Student can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should fill in the leave forms to be supplied to the students (@ Rs. 5/- per booklet).
- ii) A tutor can recommend leave upto 3 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 5 days, a student must get the application signed by the Senior Tutor. In case Sr. Tutor is on leave the application may be got signed by the Tutor-in-Chief.
- iii) Leave during House Examination / Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Senior Tutor.
- iv) Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

b. Duty Leave Rules

- i. Participation by the students in Sports / Cultural / NSS/ NCC / Co-Curricular activities, Inter College/ University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition. Duty Leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity In charge.

- c. The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without leave continuously for five days in any class / subject (Theory or Practical)
In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within 1st five days with first re-admission fee of Rs. 200/- on a prescribed performa. If the candidate fails to seek re-admission within first five days then he/she should seek re-admission upto 8 days, on payment of Rs. 300 as second readmission fee on the personal presence of parent / guardian. After 8 days from the date of his / her name is struck off, there shall be no re-admission in any case.

HOUSE EXAMINATION AND LECTURE ATTENDANCE

All the students have to appear in the House Examination which will be conducted in the first week of December. House Examination is a very useful exercise as the students come to learn about their shortcomings. Moreover, House Examination is a rehearsal for the University Examinations. Every student has to appear in the House Examination and secure at least 20% marks in each subject or 25% marks in aggregate failing which he/she will be debarred from appearing in University Examination. Moreover a student who fails to show satisfactory result in House Examination shall forfeit his / her claims to fee concession or other financial assistance. The students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in theory & practical

separately. The Principal can condone the actual participated days in every course including practical in respect of students who have to miss classes on account of their participation in NCC / NSS / Sports / Cultural / Academic / Co-Curricular activities.

Rules for Computer Lab:-

1. Lab computers are for academic and research use. Personal e-mailing, chat and games are not permitted.
2. Setting on the computers should not be changed.
3. Pen drive / mobile and other external storage media can not be installed without the permission of LA or Class Teacher. Otherwise a fine of Rs. 500/- will be charged and device will be captured.
4. Accessing prohibited sites may invite penalty or suspension from the Lab/College.
