15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college endeavours to provide the best education for the holistic development of the human resource of the college. It provides an effective learning platform for students by broadening the horizon of education beyond their subject knowledge while offering Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) courses in UG and Elective Courses in PG.

1. Our institution as a constituent college of Himachal Pradesh University strictly adheres to the curriculum framed by the affiliating University which has planned to implement the new curriculum as per NEP 2020 from the next academic session 2023-24.

2. The committees for various subjects have been constituted by the university for NEP implementation. The NEP committee for Sanskrit is headed by our Principal Dr. Rajesh Sharma.

3.The focus on making education multidisciplinary is a significant step that will benefit students, and will have far reaching effects. G C Dharamshala, being a constituent college of HP University, Shimla adheres to the policies formulated by it. In view of the NEP, a Task Force has been constituted to reframe the syllabus that will include more Multidisciplinary /Interdisciplinary courses to the already existing ones. All programmes are being designed in such a way that students will get maximum flexibility to choose courses offered by other Departments. It can be said that the University is proactively working towards implementation of the suggestions given in the NEP

4. In the present curriculum, the students take up Generic Elective (GE) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) across departments thus exercising academic freedom and multidisciplinary approach.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institution preparedness in implementation of Academic Bank of Credits depends upon the guidelines of the affiliated university and Higher Education Department, Shimla. For this purpose, a centralised database along with the database of the college is to be established to digitally store the academic credits earned by the student from various courses so that the credit earned by student previously could be forwarded when the student enters into the program again. For monitoring ABC, proper technical support system is to be created.

17.Skill development:

The college realizes the importance and the necessity of developing skills among students, and creating work ready manpower on large scale. The institutional preparedness reflects clearly in running of skill courses such as Retail Management, Tourism and Hospitality . The college also facilitates certificate courses such as Digital Marketing, Web Developing and Accounts Executive offered by HPKVN (Himachal Pradesh KAUSHAL VIKAS KENDRAS .Our BBA, MBA, B.Tech in CSE ,Bio Technology programmes are also designed in a way to mould future managers thoroughly conversant with the application of tools and techniques of modern management practices in order to align with the Government of India's National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and requirements of Industry

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The Institute encourages learning of national language of Hindi by offering UG and PG degrees in Hindi. In order to promote /integrate the local language, art and culture, compulsary activities in the curriculum has been added like literary activities etc. College Magazine includes different sections such as Pahari Section, Gadiyali Section to promote folk language and culture. A Gadiyali Cultural Function is organized by the college Kailash Association every year, in which Tribal Ethos and Practides are showcased. Since this college has a significant number of Gorkha students, their participation is ensured in every cultural function of the college. Besides, our college prepares folk songs and dance and even skits in vernacular language every year to participate in Youth Festival Programmes. . Field trips to local heritage sites/museum are also organized to

increase awareness of the culture and traditions.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institute has well defined Outcomes Based Education Template. Program Outcomes (PO), Program Educational outcomes (PEO) and Course Outcomes (CO) are followed in spirit by the instructional mechanism and are also posted on college website. Students are also sensetized by the teachers in departmental orientation programmes. Students are assessed as per OBE attainment model. For further keeping up with guidelines of NEP 2020 the process outlined above would be further strengthened and attainment levels will continue to be monitored closely to modify the pedagogy and /or the evaluation, if necessary.

20.Distance education/online education:

1. COVID 19 pandemic which caught the whole world unaware made online teaching a new normal as a transformation from the conventional classroom interface.

2. The college faculty used resources like internet services, power point presentations, projectors, interactive flat panel displays, smart boards etc. at both the personal level and the college infrastructure to develop their skills and save a whole generation from lagging behind in earning knowledge despite lockdowns and quarantines that was never experienced before.

3. However, the access to online education still remains a challenge for us with the students predominantly belonging to rural and far -flung areas facing issues like irregular power supply, poor internet connectivity, and above all non - affordability of necessary devices.

4. As NEP lays a lot of emphasis on technology - based education, the college has developed infrastructure by purchasing new computer systems, projectors & interactive panels, updating networking and bandwidth along with ensuring continuous supply of electricity through DG set.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The College is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, and follows the Curriculum it prescribes. Apart from the regular B.A/B.Sc./B.Com and PG Courses, the College also offers self-financed courses like BCA, MCA, MBA, Biotechnology and Certificate Courses.

- To systemise everything at the beginning of the session, the academic processes are streamlined by considering all essential components like the academic calendar, availability of teachers/students, workloads, timetable and infrastructure.
- The academic design comes into action through lectures, seminars/webinars, presentations, tutorials, assignments and academic discussions both in offline/online mode as per requirement. To keep abreast of recent times, teachers are encouraged to use ICT-enabled lecture delivery, audio-visual aids, smart boards and LCD projectors. Educational tours and

field visits are organised periodically to take students beyond the Curriculum.

- The Institution tracks students' academic progress through Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA). CCA accounts for 30% of the final grade. It is determined based on class room attendance (5 marks), Mid Term Test (15 Marks), and Assignments/Seminars (10 marks). The result of Mid Term examination is submitted to the examination committee for maintaining the records and to award the meritorious students for their achievements.
- To strengthen the pursuit of effective curriculum transaction, tutorial groups are formed and mentors are provided to the students as per their needs.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Institution aims at establishing a supportive learning culture for all kinds of learners and clearly understands that the conventional one-size-fits-all approach in teaching doesn't benefit much. So, immediately after students get admitted to the College, teachers start assessing their learning levels. Different mechanisms are used to identify learners' levels, such as observation methods, oral and written class tests, group discussions and internal examinations, etc. Once the level is determined, the fast, moderate and slow learners are approached differently. Since most of our students hail from rural backgrounds, it is observed that they find it challenging to communicate in English. Keeping this in mind, the bilingual method is used for teaching, and they are encouraged to explore and learn at their own pace until they overcome their hesitation and adapt. Slow learners do not have intellectual disability, but it takes longer to understand and grasp concepts. So, Remedial Classes are organised to bring the learners to par. While generally, the teaching methods are aimed at moderate learners, it is fully understood that gifted learners may not remain unattended. So the advanced learners are stimulated and encouraged to read extra books and given additional assignments. For the holistic development of the students, the College organises numerous academic, sports and cultural events through NSS, NCC, Rovers and Rangers and Sports. Students receive recognition for their accomplishments at multiple forums through scholarships, cash rewards, medals, and appreciation certificates.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The College's teaching methodology focuses on imparting education through a student-centric approach. Academic activities such as discussions, debates, presentations and workshops are integral to interactive and participative learning. Clubs /Societies and Units contribute immensely to creating a participative learning atmosphere. Students participate in extension activities through NSS, NCC, Rovers & Rangers and Red Ribbon Club that help them to learn civic engagement, career development, cultural awareness, leadership, and other professional and intellectual skills. Cleanliness drives, plantation drives, gender equity awareness programs, and visits to villages and slum areas are regular college activities that help engage students intellectually, creatively, emotionally, socially and physically. Programmes like "Swar Samvaad" (a CSCA function) allow pupils to take the initiative, make decisions, and accept the outcomes positively. Another programme for developing student leaders that give students free rein to plan the event is the Tourizmo Trigarth Carnival. Department of Geography, Psychology, Sociology and Geology organise field works for the students to provide opportunities for the students to learn the application of knowledge to a "real world" setting. Students ' use of ICT & Eresources is encouraged to be competent for the present times.

- The College has a Wi-Fi Enabled Campus, which helps the teachers and students to stay connected to the internet and learn and teach updated information. It allows students to gather updates for various competitive exams and fill up online forms for exams or any other issue related to HP University.
- The College has ICT-enabled Classrooms with Desktops, Laptops, and Projectors, which help the e-learning process. There are well-established computer labs. There is also a Wi-Fi-enabled language lab.
- The Institution has a partially digital library. Students are provided with access to e-journals, INFLIBNET and library databases. The library database is prepared to help students and teachers to search for books easily in the Library.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

- The structure of Internal Assessment is followed as per the norms of HPU, Shimla. It acquires 30% weightage in the overall assessment of the students. The breakup of Internal Assessment is as follows: 15 % through House Examination, 10% through Assignments, Projects and Presentations, 5% through Attendance.
- To maintain punctuality, a minimum of 75 % attendance is a mandatory eligibility criterion for the students.
- To ensure transparency, the students are informed about the basic eligibility of the Internal Assessment Evaluation Criteria through the college website, notice boards and class counselling. Teachers ensure that the students know it and discuss it in detail to enhance transparency and involvement.
- Assignments, class tests, seminars, paper presentations and mini-projects are a regular curriculum feature. These students are provided multiple opportunities to improve their performance and make the teaching-learning environment

more exciting and compelling.

- Some disciplines, such as Commerce, Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, Computer Applications and Mathematics, have Practical Components as part of their Curriculum, which focuses on problem-solving skills using ICT techniques and Software. They are assessed through practical exams.
- Midterm test winners are recognised at an annual function to motivate students, while the weaker students are enrolled in remedial sessions.
- Teachers are free to determine their evaluation strategy for the 10% of marks awarded for presentations, assignment submissions, or even viva voce, with the understanding that participation by students in interactive sessions, PowerPoint presentations, projects, and assignments is encouraged.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

- As a constituent college of HPU Shimla, it follows the guidelines set by the University for conducting examinations. Final exams are uniformly conducted for students across all the constituent colleges of the University. The final exam for each paper has 70% weightage of the overall assessment, and the remaining 30% constitutes internal assessment marks.
- Students are given information about the requirements for internal assessment at the start of each session. Internal assessment is part of a continuous evaluation system that includes class tests, tutorials, assignments, projects, and presentations. All of these are completed in an organised, open, and systematic fashion.
- Once the assessment is prepared, it is conveyed to the students by the concerned teacher. The faculty takes up the rightful grievances of the students about the marks obtained in the internal evaluation. To maintain transparency in the process, the answer sheets of the house tests are shown to the students. Final marks are sent to the University only after each student has been given ample opportunity and time

to review and register her complaint, if any.

The Institution organises a range of extension activities for community welfare that also help students' multifaceted development. These are:-

Red Ribbon Club: The Red Ribbon Club is a voluntary on-campus intervention program for students. The programme organised by RRC addresses the youth's knowledge, attitude and behaviour in the interrelated areas of Voluntary Blood Donation, HIV & AIDS.

Rovers &Rangers: The unit of Rovers and Rangers functions under the guidelines of Bharat & Scout-the volunteers of this unit shoulder significant responsibilities in various activities in the College.

Departmental Societies: Various activities were undertaken by the Tagore Literary Society, Science Society and Geography society beneficial for the students in general. Different societies organised field survey, guest lectures and awareness programs.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

- The Institution is easily accessible and has a campus area of 12.25 acres which is well-equipped with good-quality infrastructure for academics and extra-curricular and cocurricular activities.
- Built to cater to the educational needs of the hilly area, the institute remains a popular destination for students, especially girls from regions like Kullu, Chamba and Lahul &Spiti, as it also provides affordable hostel facilities. Currently, it has two girls' hostels and one boys' hostel to accommodate students from different parts of the state.
- The whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled for the benefit of students and faculty.
- The College facilitates a blend of traditional and modern modes of teaching by providing podiums, green boards, LCD screens, Wi-Fi/ LAN, LMS and ICT facilities.
- The College has taken measures to address the need for vigilance and security. The campus is CCTV-enabled to cater to the safety requirements.
- The well-stocked College Library is spread over two floors of an imposing building, with a total area of 3250 sq meters. It is Wi-Fi enabled and has a seating capacity of 240.
- The College owns a magnificent auditorium with a seating capacity of about 1026, extensively used for extracurricular events and hosting functions. It has an advanced light and sound system.
- The college campus has been made specially-abled friendly by constructing special ramps and washrooms.
- For students' recreation, there is a canteen facility.

• The College has a primary health care unit to provide medical support.

- A seminar hall and a multipurpose Prayas hall also provide a convenient space for organising cultural events.
- The College participates actively in Inter college competitions like Youth Festival, wherein multiple cultural events are organised. Due to its well-equipped infrastructure, the College also gets to host such significant events.
- The College's expansive playground offers a variety of sports, including basketball, volleyball, football, cricket, and even cricket. A badminton court, table tennis, and a gymnasium are included among the indoor facilities.
- The College has also acquired back its shooting range from the district administration this year; its renovation is underway.
- Besides, there is a provision of availing indoor and outdoor sports facilities from DYSA (District Sports and Youth Affairs), which lies close to the College.
- Students of the College can also avail of the cricket facility on a membership basis from HPCA (Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association), which lies adjacent to the college campus.

This is done by the purchase committee comprising senior faculty members of the College. A proper stock register of sports equipment purchased and in use is maintained. Every year facilities are upgraded by adding new types of equipment.
- A strong firewall has been installed to protect the computer systems from data theft.
- The College has different teaching blocks with wellventilated and well-maintained classrooms, some of which are ICT enabled. Additional committees and clubs have been constituted for the upkeep and maintenance of various physical, academic facilities. College Advisory Committee, Infrastructure Development and Maintenance Committee, and Purchase Committee ensure transparency, accountability and fairness in the procurement of necessary articles required in the College.

- Rooftop Solar Power Plant: It is a 55KVA Solar Grid Interactive Power Plant with a unit generation capacity of 57600 per year.

The college follows the practice of decentralization and participative management in its truesense. The administration is decentralized to ensure the quality of educational provisions. Theadministrative functions of the institution are mostly carried out in a participatory manner through various committees. The Principal conducts meetings with the Conveners of variouscommittees, College Advisory, IQAC, RUSA Coordinator, CSCA, PTA, and OSA in whichdiscussions are held and decisions are taken with comprehensive consultations. The administrative staff is also entrusted with varied responsibilities. Proposals are also invitedfrom the departments for the necessary development of infrastructure etc. and steps are takenkeeping in view the availability of the finances.

Case Study: The practice of decentralization and participatory management is reflected in the effective conduction of exams by the college which has the strength of more than six thousand

students. The mid-term exams/house exams are conducted in the College every year by the examination committee of the College. The convener/in-charge of the examination committee calls a meeting of all the faculty members chaired by the Principal of the College. The convenient dates for theexams, completion of syllabus, and the schedule of other activities of the College are taken intoaccount while deciding the schedule of examinations. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

The College has a perspective plan of development which has been preparedby IQAC after consultation with all the stakeholders. It also includes various componentslike introduction of new courses and filling up vacant teaching posts on priority basis. A new Science Blockequipped with modern facilities is under construction at the cost of about Rs. 9 Crores. Toprovide potential career opportunities to the students in the global corporate world, selffinancing courses had been introduced in the college. Taking a step to fulfill the urgentrequirement in terms of infrastructure (e.g. smart class rooms, conference halls, computerlabs) new MBA Block and B. Tech Block are to be constructed. A multipurpose hall forMCA department has also been constructed. In order to provide a greener environmentto the future generations, a step towards environment protection is the installation of thesolar panel. An internal committee was constituted in college for assessing the viability of the project. The committee submitted a positive report and the matter was discussed withIQAC. A site survey was conducted and three Solar panels of 25 KVA, 15KVA and 15 KVA wereproposed and installed on the roof tops of Prayas Bhawan, Library and Arts Block. Toprovide easy access to the library resources and the library facilities, automation of thelibrary and learning resources is under process. The college campus is also to be fullycomputerized with Wi-Fi/Internet facility. In order to provide free wi- fi facility to thestudents, Free Wi-Fi Access

The Principal of the College holds responsibility for both administrative and financial matters. Various committees are established to implement the policies of the Department of Higher Education, following the guidelines issued by the Principal Secretary of Education. The Principal is chairperson of several committees, including the College Advisory Council, IQAC, Grievances Redressal Cell for Women, Career Guidance and Placement Cell, Equal Opportunities Cell, and Hostel Advisory.

The conveners of these committees conduct meetings with their respective members and submit recommendations that the Principal approves. The Principal has the authority to make decisions and plan financial matters under the rules set by the Department of Higher Education/Government of Himachal Pradesh.

As the College is governed by the Himachal Pradesh Government, recruitment, promotion, and service rules are determined by the Government/HPPSC/SSB (Himachal Pradesh Public Service Commission/Selection Service Board). The Himachal Pradesh Government carries out the appointment of teachers through the HPPSC. The College is not authorised to recruit teachers on a regular basis, but temporary arrangements are made through the local PTA (Parent-Teacher Association) and self-financing schemes.

As the Institution is governed by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, the welfare schemes available for the government employees in the Institution are: 1) All the employees are covered under GIS(Group Insurance Scheme), and the premiums are deducted from the salary. 2) Encashment of three hundred days Earned Leave is allowed at retirement. 3) TA/DA is given to the employees whenever they go out for the official work. 4) There is full medical reimbursement as per government rates of medical expenses including indoor medical treatment. 5) Govt. employees enjoy the benefit of gratuity, commutation of pension and pension benefits. 6) Maternity/Paternity leave is provided per the government norms. 7) Medical Leave is given to employees per the Govt. norms. 8) Faculty members are eligible for study leave of two years. 9) University Guest House facility for Teaching Staff. 10) Various allowances like HRA, CA (Compensatory allowance) and DA are given as per the Centre Govt. /State Govt. notifications.

11) Duty Leave is given to the employees for attending Seminars/Conferences/ Orientation Programmes/ Refresher Courses etc. 12) Free parking facility for two-wheelers and cars. Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff 13) Creating a peaceful zone is a deliberate effort to address teachers and support staff's stress and mental well-being. This designated area provides a serene environment where individuals can seek solace and engage in activities that promote relaxation, mindfulness, and rejuvenation.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

Resource mobilisation policy and procedures of the Institution:

The Institution follows a resource mobilization policy and procedures to ensure the optimum use of funds.

Construction of College Auditorium: The Old Students Association (OSA) collaborated with the Government under a funding distribution ratio of 20:80, with OSA contributing 20% and the Government providing 80%. The College Auditorium, with a seating capacity of approximately one thousand, stands as a testament to this collaboration and serves as a venue for academic, cultural, and community events.

Revenue Generation through Auditorium Rental: The College allows external agencies to rent the Auditorium for organizing academic and cultural functions, following the college by-laws. This practice generates revenue, covering maintenance and operating costs, and potentially creates surplus funds for reinvestment.

Self-Financing Courses: The Institution offers self-financing courses such as MCA, MBA, PGDCA, B.Tech., Bio-Tech., BBA, and BCA. Tuition fees paid by students enrolled in these programs generate funds for the College. This diversifies educational offerings and meets the demands of students seeking specialized programs.

Financial Support from Government: The College receives financial support from the Government through schemes like the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) fund.

For the utilisation of funds following are procedural formalities: i) Various committees take requisition for construction, upgradation and purchase. ii) Proper estimate is prepared as per the requirement. iii) Sanctions and quotations are called for, and office orders are prepared for the same. iv) Proper inspection of the works/assignments is conducted. v) Efforts are made for optimal utilisation of the funds.

To promote hygiene and provide necessary student facilities, the College took measures to repair and construct washrooms in various departments such as Bio-Tech, BCA, MBA, and MCA.

As per the demand of the students, an additional Computer Lab & Examination Hall were constructed in MCA.

For the upgradation of the Lab, tiling of shelves and gas pipeline fitting was carried out in the Chemistry Department.

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Solid Waste Management: The College declared its campus plasticfree and put waste management strategies into place in accordance with the government's decree banning plastic. Students are educated about plastic and food waste through awareness programmes. Vermicomposting organic waste at the Department of Botany yields inexpensive, environmentally friendly fertiliser.

Liquid Waste Management: Adequate liquid waste management is ensured. Chemical Lab Waste is destroyed with utmost care and safety. Proper drainage system is functional in the Institution. Proper disposal of sewerage in the septic tanks is ensured.

Biomedical Waste Management: Biomedical waste is segregated and put in different bins. The waste is also disposed of in the pits dug in the Institution. Garbage collecting vans of the Municipal Corporation regularly visit the College to collect the waste. Vending machines with incinerators are established in the Institution for the proper disposal of menstrual waste.

E-waste Management: A committee is constituted to auction the waste; whatever is left un-auctioned is destroyed through a sanitary landfill or incineration method. LED lights are used in some parts of college campuses for the conservation of energy. Under this, Dharamsala has become the first city in Himachal where experts will scientifically collect and dispose of electronic waste.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The College is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, and follows the Curriculum it prescribes. Apart from the regular B.A/B.Sc./B.Com and PG Courses, the College also offers self-financed courses like BCA, MCA, MBA, Biotechnology and Certificate Courses.

- To systemise everything at the beginning of the session, the academic processes are streamlined by considering all essential components like the academic calendar, availability of teachers/students, workloads, timetable and infrastructure.
- The academic design comes into action through lectures, seminars/webinars, presentations, tutorials, assignments and academic discussions both in offline/online mode as per requirement. To keep abreast of recent times, teachers are encouraged to use ICT-enabled lecture delivery, audio-visual aids, smart boards and LCD projectors. Educational tours and field visits are organised periodically to take students beyond the Curriculum.
- The Institution tracks students' academic progress through Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA). CCA accounts for 30% of the final grade. It is determined based on class room attendance (5 marks), Mid Term Test (15 Marks), and Assignments/Seminars (10 marks). The result of Mid Term examination is submitted to the examination committee for maintaining the records and to award the meritorious students for their achievements.
- To strengthen the pursuit of effective curriculum transaction, tutorial groups are formed and mentors are provided to the students as per their needs.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Institution aims at establishing a supportive learning culture for all kinds of learners and clearly understands that the conventional one-size-fits-all approach in teaching doesn't benefit much. So, immediately after students get admitted to the College, teachers start assessing their learning levels. Different mechanisms are used to identify learners' levels, such as observation methods, oral and written class tests, group discussions and internal examinations, etc. Once the level is determined, the fast, moderate and slow learners are approached differently. Since most of our students hail from rural backgrounds, it is observed that they find it challenging to communicate in English. Keeping this in mind, the bilingual method is used for teaching, and they are encouraged to explore and learn at their own pace until they overcome their hesitation and adapt. Slow learners do not have intellectual disability, but it takes longer to understand and grasp concepts. So, Remedial Classes are organised to bring the

learners to par. While generally, the teaching methods are aimed at moderate learners, it is fully understood that gifted learners may not remain unattended. So the advanced learners are stimulated and encouraged to read extra books and given additional assignments. For the holistic development of the students, the College organises numerous academic, sports and cultural events through NSS, NCC, Rovers and Rangers and Sports. Students receive recognition for their accomplishments at multiple forums through scholarships, cash rewards, medals, and appreciation certificates.

Cleanliness drives, plantation drives, gender equity awareness programs, and visits to villages and slum areas are regular college activities that help engage students intellectually, creatively, emotionally, socially and physically. Programmes like "Swar Samvaad" (a CSCA function) allow pupils to take the initiative, make decisions, and accept the outcomes positively. Another programme for developing student leaders that give students free rein to plan the event is the Tourizmo Trigarth Carnival. Department of Geography, Psychology, Sociology and Geology organise field works for the students to provide opportunities for the students to learn the application of knowledge to a "real world" setting. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

- The structure of Internal Assessment is followed as per the norms of HPU, Shimla. It acquires 30% weightage in the overall assessment of the students. The breakup of Internal Assessment is as follows: 15 % through House Examination, 10% through Assignments, Projects and Presentations, 5% through Attendance.
- To maintain punctuality, a minimum of 75 % attendance is a mandatory eligibility criterion for the students.
- To ensure transparency, the students are informed about the basic eligibility of the Internal Assessment Evaluation Criteria through the college website, notice boards and class counselling. Teachers ensure that the students know it and discuss it in detail to enhance

transparency and involvement.

- Assignments, class tests, seminars, paper presentations and mini-projects are a regular curriculum feature. These students are provided multiple opportunities to improve their performance and make the teaching-learning environment more exciting and compelling.
- Some disciplines, such as Commerce, Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, Computer Applications and Mathematics, have Practical Components as part of their Curriculum, which focuses on problem-solving skills using ICT techniques and Software. They are assessed through practical exams.
- Midterm test winners are recognised at an annual function to motivate students, while the weaker students are enrolled in remedial sessions.
- Teachers are free to determine their evaluation strategy for the 10% of marks awarded for presentations, assignment submissions, or even viva voce, with the understanding that participation by students in interactive sessions, PowerPoint presentations, projects, and assignments is encouraged.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

- As a constituent college of HPU Shimla, it follows the guidelines set by the University for conducting examinations. Final exams are uniformly conducted for students across all the constituent colleges of the University. The final exam for each paper has 70% weightage of the overall assessment, and the remaining 30% constitutes internal assessment marks.
- Students are given information about the requirements for internal assessment at the start of each session.
 Internal assessment is part of a continuous evaluation system that includes class tests, tutorials, assignments, projects, and presentations. All of these are completed in an organised, open, and systematic fashion.
- Once the assessment is prepared, it is conveyed to the

students by the concerned teacher. The faculty takes up the rightful grievances of the students about the marks obtained in the internal evaluation. To maintain transparency in the process, the answer sheets of the house tests are shown to the students. Final marks are sent to the University only after each student has been given ample opportunity and time to review and register her complaint, if any.

3.4 - Extension Activities

The Institution organises a range of extension activities for community welfare that also help students' multifaceted development. These are:-

National Service Scheme (NSS): There are two NSS Units in the College, one for each gender. It plans student camps both on and off the college campus. In the adjacent villages, NSS volunteers conduct adult literacy campaigns, sanitation campaigns, and plantation initiatives. Additionally, run healthrelated programmes in surrounding villages. A lot of times, Government and non-government agencies work together to host blood donation camps.

Red Ribbon Club: The Red Ribbon Club is a voluntary on-campus intervention program for students. The programme organised by RRC addresses the youth's knowledge, attitude and behaviour in the interrelated areas of Voluntary Blood Donation, HIV & AIDS.

Rovers & Rangers: The unit of Rovers and Rangers functions under the guidelines of Bharat & Scout-the volunteers of this unit shoulder significant responsibilities in various activities in the College.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

- The Institution is easily accessible and has a campus area of 12.25 acres which is well-equipped with goodquality infrastructure for academics and extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.
- Built to cater to the educational needs of the hilly area, the institute remains a popular destination for students, especially girls from regions like Kullu, Chamba and Lahul &Spiti, as it also provides affordable hostel facilities. Currently, it has two girls' hostels and one boys' hostel to accommodate students from different parts of the state.
- The whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled for the benefit of students and faculty.
- The College facilitates a blend of traditional and modern modes of teaching by providing podiums, green boards, LCD screens, Wi-Fi/ LAN, LMS and ICT facilities.
- The College has taken measures to address the need for vigilance and security. The campus is CCTV-enabled to cater to the safety requirements.
- The well-stocked College Library is spread over two floors of an imposing building, with a total area of 3250 sq meters. It is Wi-Fi enabled and has a seating capacity of 240.

- The College owns a magnificent auditorium with a seating capacity of about 1026, extensively used for extracurricular events and hosting functions. It has an advanced light and sound system.
- The college campus has been made specially-abled friendly by constructing special ramps and washrooms.
- For students' recreation, there is a canteen facility.
- The College has a primary health care unit to provide medical support.

- The College has a multifunctional theatre with exceptional acoustics, a sound system with ten speakers, six amplifiers, a mixer, six wireless microphones, and three more microphones, with a seating capacity of 1026 people. A projector and screen are also included among the auditorium's amenities. There is a 62-light stage lighting system.
- A seminar hall and a multipurpose Prayas hall also provide a convenient space for organising cultural events.
- The College participates actively in Inter college competitions like Youth Festival, wherein multiple cultural events are organised. Due to its well-equipped infrastructure, the College also gets to host such significant events.
- The College's expansive playground offers a variety of sports, including basketball, volleyball, football, cricket, and even cricket. A badminton court, table tennis, and a gymnasium are included among the indoor facilities.
- The College has also acquired back its shooting range from the district administration this year; its renovation is underway.

- Besides, there is a provision of availing indoor and outdoor sports facilities from DYSA (District Sports and Youth Affairs), which lies close to the College.
- Students of the College can also avail of the cricket facility on a membership basis from HPCA (Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association), which lies adjacent to the college campus.
- NSS is running a Martial Arts Club to teach such techniques to the students.

- The maintenance of all the laboratories of various departments falls under the supervision of lab attendants supervised by a senior lecturer assistant (SLA). The stock verification committee methodically maintains and checks stock registers at the end of every financial year.
- The Principal constitutes a library committee to discuss various issues concerning the Library. All newly purchased books and journals are entered into library accession registers. Damaged/lost books are written off by following all codal formalities and procedures as per govt.HP regulations.
- The latest equipment required for different sports activities is purchased at the beginning of the new session and as and when needed. This is done by the

purchase committee comprising senior faculty members of the College. A proper stock register of sports equipment purchased and in use is maintained. Every year facilities are upgraded by adding new types of equipment.

- A strong firewall has been installed to protect the computer systems from data theft.
- The College has different teaching blocks with wellventilated and well-maintained classrooms, some of which are ICT enabled. Additional committees and clubs have been constituted for the upkeep and maintenance of various physical, academic facilities. College Advisory Committee, Infrastructure Development and Maintenance Committee, and Purchase Committee ensure transparency, accountability and fairness in the procurement of necessary articles required in the College.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

The college follows the practice of decentralization and participative management in its truesense. The administration is decentralized to ensure the quality of educational provisions. Theadministrative functions of the institution are mostly carried out in a participatory manner through various committees. The Principal conducts meetings with the Conveners of variouscommittees, College Advisory, IQAC, RUSA Coordinator, CSCA, PTA, and OSA in whichdiscussions are held and decisions are taken with comprehensive consultations. The administrative staff is also entrusted with varied responsibilities. Proposals are also invitedfrom the departments for the necessary development of infrastructure etc. and steps are takenkeeping in view the availability of the finances.

Case Study: The practice of decentralization and participatory management is reflected in the effective conduction of exams by the college which has the strength of more than six thousand students. The mid-term exams/house exams are conducted in the College every year by the examination committee of the College. The convener/in-charge of the examination committee calls a meeting of all the faculty members chaired by the Principal of the College. The convenient dates for the exams, completion of syllabus, and the schedule of other activities of the College are taken into account while deciding the schedule of examinations. For the smooth conduction of exams, the teaching and nonteaching staff of the college is duly assigned the duties. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

The College has a perspective plan of development which has been preparedby IQAC after consultation with all the stakeholders. It also includes various componentslike introduction of new courses and filling up vacant teaching posts on priority basis.A new Science Blockequipped with modern

facilities is under construction at the cost of about Rs. 9 Crores.Toprovide potential career opportunities to the students in the global corporate world, selffinancing courses had been introduced in the college. Taking a step to fulfill the urgentrequirement in terms of infrastructure (e.g. smart class rooms, conference halls, computerlabs) new MBA Block and B. Tech Block are to be constructed. A multipurpose hall forMCA department has also been constructed. In order to provide a greener environmentto the future generations, a step towards environment protection is the installation of thesolar panel. An internal committee was constituted in college for assessing the viability of the project. The committee submitted a positive report and the matter was discussed withIQAC. A site survey was conducted and three Solar panels of 25 KVA,15KVA and 15 KVA wereproposed and installed on the roof tops of Prayas Bhawan, Library and Arts Block. Toprovide easy access to the library resources and the library facilities, automation of thelibrary and learning resources is under process. The college campus is also to be fullycomputerized with Wi-Fi/Internet facility. In order to provide free wi- fi facility to thestudents, Free Wi-Fi Access Zones, are marked in the campus.

The Principal of the College holds responsibility for both administrative and financial matters. Various committees are established to implement the policies of the Department of Higher Education, following the guidelines issued by the Principal Secretary of Education. The Principal is chairperson of several committees, including the College Advisory Council, IQAC, Grievances Redressal Cell for Women, Career Guidance and Placement Cell, Equal Opportunities Cell, and Hostel Advisory.

The conveners of these committees conduct meetings with their respective members and submit recommendations that the

Principal approves. The Principal has the authority to make decisions and plan financial matters under the rules set by the Department of Higher Education/Government of Himachal Pradesh.

As the College is governed by the Himachal Pradesh Government, recruitment, promotion, and service rules are determined by the Government/HPPSC/SSB (Himachal Pradesh Public Service Commission/Selection Service Board). The Himachal Pradesh Government carries out the appointment of teachers through the HPPSC. The College is not authorised to recruit teachers on a regular basis, but temporary arrangements are made through the local PTA (Parent-Teacher Association) and self-financing schemes.

As the Institution is governed by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, the welfare schemes available for the government employees in the Institution are: 1) All the employees are covered under GIS(Group Insurance Scheme), and the premiums are deducted from the salary. 2) Encashment of three hundred days Earned Leave is allowed at retirement. 3) TA/DA is given to the employees whenever they go out for the official work. 4) There is full medical reimbursement as per government rates of medical expenses including indoor medical treatment. 5) Govt. employees enjoy the benefit of gratuity, commutation of pension and pension benefits. 6) Maternity/Paternity leave is provided per the government norms. 7) Medical Leave is given to employees per the Govt. norms. 8) Faculty members are eligible for study leave of two years. 9) University Guest House facility for Teaching Staff. 10) Various allowances like HRA, CA (Compensatory allowance) and DA are given as per the Centre Govt. /State Govt. notifications.

11) Duty Leave is given to the employees for attending Seminars/Conferences/ Orientation Programmes/ Refresher Courses etc. 12) Free parking facility for two-wheelers and cars. Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff 13) Creating a peaceful zone is a deliberate effort to address teachers and support staff's stress and mental well-being. This designated area provides a serene environment where individuals can seek solace and engage in activities that promote relaxation, mindfulness, and rejuvenation.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

Resource mobilisation policy and procedures of the Institution:

The Institution follows a resource mobilization policy and procedures to ensure the optimum use of funds.

Construction of College Auditorium: The Old Students Association (OSA) collaborated with the Government under a funding distribution ratio of 20:80, with OSA contributing 20% and the Government providing 80%. The College Auditorium, with a seating capacity of approximately one thousand, stands as a testament to this collaboration and serves as a venue for academic, cultural, and community events.

Revenue Generation through Auditorium Rental: The College allows external agencies to rent the Auditorium for organizing academic and cultural functions, following the college by-laws. This practice generates revenue, covering maintenance and operating costs, and potentially creates surplus funds for reinvestment.

Self-Financing Courses: The Institution offers self-financing courses such as MCA, MBA, PGDCA, B.Tech., Bio-Tech., BBA, and BCA. Tuition fees paid by students enrolled in these programs generate funds for the College. This diversifies educational offerings and meets the demands of students seeking specialized programs.

Financial Support from Government: The College receives financial support from the Government through schemes like the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) fund.

For the utilisation of funds following are procedural formalities: i) Various committees take requisition for construction, upgradation and purchase. ii) Proper estimate is prepared as per the requirement. iii) Sanctions and quotations are called for, and office orders are prepared for the same. iv) Proper inspection of the works/assignments is conducted. v) Efforts are made for optimal utilisation of the funds.

By extending the retaining wall, the College can effectively control the entry and exit points, ensuring the safety and security of the students, staff, and facilities.

To promote hygiene and provide necessary student facilities, the College took measures to repair and construct washrooms in various departments such as Bio-Tech, BCA, MBA, and MCA.

As per the demand of the students, an additional Computer Lab & Examination Hall were constructed in MCA.

For the upgradation of the Lab, tiling of shelves and gas pipeline fitting was carried out in the Chemistry Department.

Through a Special Counselling Cell for girls, an Equal Opportunity Cell, and Gender Champions, the college fosters gender sensitivity. In addition to organising gender-related extended courses, seminars, and visits, these cells actively mentor and encourage female students in their academic and personal endeavours.

The College disseminates information through display boards and its official website to inform students about important government schemes, events, legislation, and court rulings.

Furthermore, the College runs an exclusive girls' wing in the NCC (National Cadet Corps) program. This initiative provides excellent opportunities for young girls to channel their energy into constructive activities, learn self-defence techniques, develop a spirit of adventure, and build confidence and resilience.

Guidelines of the Government issued from time to time regarding all sorts of waste are strictly adhered to.

Solid Waste Management: The College declared its campus plasticfree and put waste management strategies into place in accordance with the government's decree banning plastic. Students are educated about plastic and food waste through awareness programmes. Vermicomposting organic waste at the Department of Botany yields inexpensive, environmentally friendly fertiliser.

Liquid Waste Management: Adequate liquid waste management is ensured. Chemical Lab Waste is destroyed with utmost care and safety. Proper drainage system is functional in the Institution. Proper disposal of sewerage in the septic tanks is ensured.

Biomedical Waste Management: Biomedical waste is segregated and put in different bins. The waste is also disposed of in the pits dug in the Institution. Garbage collecting vans of the Municipal Corporation regularly visit the College to collect the waste. Vending machines with incinerators are established in the Institution for the proper disposal of menstrual waste.

E-waste Management: A committee is constituted to auction the waste; whatever is left un-auctioned is destroyed through a sanitary landfill or incineration method. LED lights are used in some parts of college campuses for the conservation of energy. Under this, Dharamsala has become the first city in Himachal where experts will scientifically collect and dispose of electronic waste.
