The foundation stone of the college was laid way-back in 1912. In the year 1926 it was elevated to the level of an intermediate college; upgraded to the level of graduation in 1947 and was the first college of the state to introduce Post-Graduation in different streams in 1977. The journey of success continues as it was accredited "B" grade in 2003 and "A" grade in 2015, by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bengaluru). The evolution and growth of the college has been phenomenal. Apart from the regular streams of Arts, Science and Commerce, the college also offers self-financing courses like BBA, BCA, PGDCA, MBA, MCA, B.VOC and B.Sc.-Biotech which benefit the students not only from Himachal but also from Northern India. From the current session, the institution received a nod to start post graduation in three more subjects i.e Commerce, Chemistry and Geography. All these three PG Courses are also running successfully in the institution and the students of 1st semester will sit in their final exam in the month of May. The vision and mission of this educational institution has been to impart knowledge, build careers, develop skills and focus on holistic growth and development of each and every student so that they are competent enough to face the challenges of a bigger world.

The pages of this report will speak volumes of the achievements of this educational institution. I may please be permitted to present before you the annual report for the academic session 2017-18.

STAFF

The college has a total number of 75 sanctioned posts in the teaching faculty, and out of these 44 posts are filled on regular basis, 16 on contract and the remaining 15 posts are lying vacant in various subjects. In the non-teaching staff, the college has 44 sanctioned posts and out of which 25 are filled up on regular basis, 1 on contract and 18 are lying vacant in various categories. One peon is on daily wages basis.

IQAC

As per the requirement of NAAC, the college has a functional IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell). Under the aegis of the cell, all the developmental activities of the college with respect to teaching, research, inter-institutional collaboration, infrastructure etc. are planned and implemented. Record of all the activities related to students and teachers is maintained by the cell and report thereof sent to NAAC, Bengaluru from time to time. A proper committee is constituted to assure developmental activities under this cell.

LIBRARY

(Librarian: Smt. Anjana Dharwal)

The college has a spacious and magnificent library which is completely computerized and it has a total number of 62311 books on its shelves on various subjects. In the current session, 24 magazines, 09 Journals and 12 different newspapers in Hindi and English languages are subscribed for the students. Through software facility INFLIBNET more than 75000 e-journals and books can be accessed. Digital cataloguing of general section is complete. Some rare books were identified and steps were taken to preserve them. More than 200 students visit the library daily. The college library attracts students aspiring for various competitive exams and this library contributes maximum to their success.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator: Prof. Nikesh Sharma)

The college started BCA course from the session 2010 under self-financing scheme and forty students are admitted in this course in every session through written competitive exam followed by an interview. From the session 2018 onwards, Himachal University has increased our seats from 40 to 60. Out of 60 seats, forty seats are under subsidized category and twenty seats are under non-subsidized category. The course has added a new chapter in the achievement of the institution. Suraj Kumar, student of BCA 6th semester got first prize in declamation contest held at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University and was awarded by Hon'ble Governor and Education Minister J & K. He also received the Jury award for National Youth Parliament festival and the guests were Hon'ble Prime Minister and Sports Minister. In the current session, 2 students of BCA 6th semester already got selected in Wipro Technology as well as Infosys through off Campus placement. The Dept. also organized various seminars on the current developments in the fields of Information Technology and also on general topics like "Natural Disasters" etc. In this session 18 new Computers have been installed in the computer lab. The mission of this course remains to develop the personality of the students and make them capable to be selected in higher courses in good universities.

MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

(Coordinator: Dr. Sanjay Pathania)

Master of Computer Applications is a post-graduate program of Govt. P.G. College Dharamshala. The program started from the year 2012. It is a three-year program spread over six semesters to bridge the chasm between computer studies and applications bringing within reach of enthusiastic youngsters by an excellent group of experienced and dedicated staff, and an enviable infrastructure. MCA department strives to shape outstanding computer professionals with ethical and human values to reshape nation's destiny. The department aims to provide an excellent learning opportunity for all students and staff to develop knowledge and skills essential in enlightening the individual's ability to think vitally and utilize information technology to meet the technological challenges of tomorrow and to refine knowledge and understanding through research and creativity. Department has shown its presence in the University as students from the 1st semester Hitika wason , Kajal Patial, Abhay Sharma ,Sarita Sharma of 2nd ,6th and 10th sem respectively and students ShivaniChanoria, Vishaw Nath Arora, Shivam Pant and Shivani from 4th semester have bagged 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 6th positions respectively in the University throughout the State. The very first month of the new session commenced with the bang as Department of MCA organized 3 days Induction Orientation Programme. In order to know the corporate world New Batch has started his journey with the department with 3 days Induction Orientation Programme in which speakers from different areas shared their views with the students of the department.

Department also organizes various seminars on burning topics from time to time in which speakers from the Corporate groups deliver their valuable thoughts and share their views on the said topics with the students. Activities like Quiz Competition, Swachta Abhiyan, Smart City, Tree Plantation, Cleanliness campaign, Wissensaire'17- Techno-Management Fest, National Unity Day, Awareness Campaign against AIDS and Drug Addiction, Awareness Campaign on Road Safety and seminar on Personality Development and Communication Skills were organized in the department in order to develop the creativity skills of the students. Industrial exposure is also an aspect of the MCA Programme. In order to give the industrial exposure to the MCA Students a 7 Days Industrial visit was organized to Ulearn Systems Ltd. Hyderabad where students experienced the working environment of the production plant.

department. POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION

The first batch of PGDCA was started in the session 2007-08 with 40(+1 Single Girl Child) seats. There are total 40 seats for students, aspiring for this course. Out of 40, 30 seats are in the category of subsidized and remaining 10 seats are under non-subsidized category. The admission for PGDCA is done on the basis of merit list. The department has highly modernized computer lab having 55 multimedia PC with broadband connectivity, projector and separate smart class rooms. The department provides extra facilities to the students regarding “HTML, CSS, JavaScript, PHP, AJAX, MySQL” for improving their skills in IT field without charging any fee. In current session 40 students are enrolled in this PGDCA course. The students belong from far-flung areas of HP. It is a matter of great pride that the students of this department got placements in various public and private sectors. The mission of this course remains to develop the personality and talent of the students and make them capable for skilled work and responsible citizens of society in this modern age of information technology.

Department organized one month “ICT Internship Course” for eight selected students in “Web Designing & Development” at “ICAI Computer Enhancement Institute Mohali”.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

(Coordinator: Dr. Manjit Singh)

BBA course was started in the college in 1997 and since then the students of BBA have been securing merit positions among the University toppers. There are 59, 57 and 57 students in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of BBA respectively. Dept. has organized the events like B-Forum, EXCELSIOR, Collage making in the current session to enhance the various management skills and creativity among the students. Seminars on personality development, time management and job avenue were organized by the BBA Dept.

INDIRA GANDHI NATIONAL OPEN UNIVERSITY (Coordinator: Prof. Veena Choudhary)

IGNOU study Centre- 1105 has the privilege to be considered as one of biggest study centre of Himachal Pradesh and was started in the college premises in 1989. The centre caters to the needs of the students of four districts of Himachal Pradesh because there are some special courses which are available only at this study centre. Dr. Janesh Joshi is the Assistant Coordinator of this centre. The centre has a highly qualified staff of counselors. DEPARTMENT OF B.VOC.

B.VOC is running very successfully in the institution and there is a cut-throat competition for this course and there are 40 seats in Hospitality and Tourism and equal no. of seats in Retail Management. At present all seats are filled up and there are total 170 students pursuing their course in Hospitality and Retail Management. The result of these courses is remarkable and the students of Hospitality and Tourism did commendable job during their training session at Club Mahindra Naldera, Hotel Ramada Jalandhar, Grand Raj Kangra, Hotel JK Kangra, Hotel River Retrica and Club Mahindra Dharamshala. CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

Incharge: Dr. Naresh Sharma

In August 2015, a full-fledged Training & Development Department was set up at our college. This was the first initiative of its kind in government educational institutions of Himachal Pradesh. It was part of the long-term plan of the NAAC Accredited Grade 'A' College to strengthen its delivery mechanism for making its students employable.

The objective of this department is, inter alia, to train students, enrolled in various self-financing programmes of the College, for successfully facing job-placement interviews. Also, the department endeavours to conduct on-campus skill training to keep our students abreast of the latest developments in their respective areas of specialization. Finally, the department attempts to liaise with industry to generate employment for our students. For all students of the college, it also serves as a one-stop point for career guidance and counseling

COLLEGE HOSTELS:

(Wardens: Prof. Dhyan Singh & Prof. Vishvajyoti)

The College has provided two hostels for girls. Hostels are categorized as general girls' hostel and tribal girls' hostel. There were 51 girls residing in tribal hostel and 42 in general hostel in 2017 session but as the inauguration of supplementary building has been done, the rooms were allotted to candidates in 2018 as per the availability of the furniture. Thereafter

in 2018, there are 52 girls residing in tribal hostel and 67 in general hostel. Manisha and Isha were the hostel prefects of tribal and general hostel respectively of 2017-18 session and Vishaka and Bandna Pathania are the hostel prefects of the tribal and general hostel respectively of 2018-19 session. During the session 2018, renovation of roof and some rooms of old building of general hostel was also completed. Renovation of roof and whitewashing of interior of Tribal girls' hostel has also taken place during the session. Water cooler has also been installed in the supplementary building of General Girls Hostel. To ensure the safety of the hostel inmates CCTV cameras were installed in both the hostels. Vending machines have also been installed in both the hostels. Further, One of the girls of tribal hostel namely Anamika distinctly participated in fencing competition and brought laurels to the college. From time to time to welcome and enable the students to know each other fresher's parties are organized and in the same way to bid adieu farewell parties are organized. To keep the eatables fresh, the provision of refrigerator is also provided to the inmates. Installation of Wi-Fi connection in both the hostels' is on progress and will start functioning very soon.

BOYS HOSTEL

There are total 27 rooms in the Tribal Boys hostel which include one guest room, one room for cook-cum-caretaker, one common room and one is used as a storeroom. The total capacity of boys hostel is 46 students. At present there are 45 energetic and aspiring students residing in the hostel. There is one aqua guard for water purification and one water cooler installed in the mess of the hostel. The common room is fully equipped with 32-inch led television and Stag table tennis. Almost all the sports articles are provided to the inmates of the hostel.

The hostel has a prefect, Mr. Pradeep Singh, and three floor representatives namely Vishavjit, Vinod and Aman and one mess in charge Jaram Singh. They all assist the hostel warden and discipline committee in taking care of the discipline and running the hostel successfully. During the past two years eight students (Mridul Jaryal, Sachin, Nikhil, Vicky, Mukesh and Kishore) have been selected in Army, Paramilitary forces and other significant departments. Every year several study circles and famous national and regional days are observed and celebrated to provide exposure to the students. Currently the hostel has one cook, one mess helper and one sweeper. The hostel subscribes two newspapers, both in Hindi and English, and two monthly competitive magazines regularly to its hostel inmates.

DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

Disaster Management

Disaster Management can be defined as the organization and management of resources and responsibilities for dealing with all humanitarian aspects of emergencies, in particular preparedness, response and recovery in order to lessen the impact of disasters.

The first people to respond to a disaster are those living in the local community. They are the first to start rescue and relief operations. Therefore focus should be given on community-based disaster preparedness, which assists communities to reduce their vulnerability to disasters and strengthen their capacities to resist them.

The United Nations defines a disaster as a serious disruption of the functioning of a community or as society. Disasters involve widespread human, material, economic or environmental impacts, which exceed the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources.

Types of Disasters

There is no country that is immune from disaster, though vulnerability to disaster varies. There are four main types of disaster.

- **Natural Disasters:** including floods, hurricanes, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions that have immediate impacts on human health and secondary impacts causing further death and suffering from (for example) floods, landslides, fires, tsunamis.
- **Environmental Emergencies:** including technological or industrial accidents, usually involving the production, use or transportation of hazardous material, and occur where these materials are produced, used or transported, and forest fires caused by humans.
- **Complex Emergencies:** involving a break-down of authority, looting and attacks on strategic installations, including conflict situations and war.
- **Pandemic Emergencies:** involving a sudden onset of contagious disease that affects health, disrupts services and businesses, brings economic and social costs.

Any disaster can interrupt essential services, such as health care, electricity, water, sewage/garbage removal, transportation and communication. The interruption can seriously

have a major and long-lasting impact on people long after the immediate effect has been mitigated. Poorly planned relief activities can have a significant negative impact not only on the disaster victims but also on donors and relief agencies. So it is important that physical therapists join established programs rather than attempting individual efforts.

Local, regional, national and international organizations are all involved in mounting a humanitarian response to disasters. Each will have a prepared disaster management plan. These plans cover prevention, preparedness, relief and recovery.

Disaster Prevention

These are activities designed to provide permanent protection from disasters. Not all disasters, particularly natural disasters, can be prevented, but the risk of loss of life and injury can be mitigated with good evacuation plans, environmental planning and design standards. In January 2005, 168 Governments adopted a 10-year global plan for natural disaster risk reduction called the Hyogo Framework. It offers guiding principles, priorities for action, and practical means for achieving disaster resilience for vulnerable communities.

Disaster Preparedness

These activities are designed to minimize the loss of life and damage- for example by removing people and property from a threatened location and by facilitating timely and effective rescue, relief and rehabilitation. Preparedness is the main way of reducing the impact of disasters. Community- based preparedness and management should be a high priority in physical therapy practice management.

Disaster Relief

This is as coordinated multi-agency response to reduce the impact of a disaster and its long - term results. Relief activities include rescue, relocation, providing food and water, preventing disease and disability, repairing vital service such as telecommunications and transport, providing temporary shelter and emergency health care.

Disaster Recovery

Once emergency needs have been met and the initial crisis is over, the people affected and the communities that support them are still vulnerable. Recovery activities include rebuilding infrastructure. These should blend with development activities, such as building human resources for health and developing policies and practices to avoid similar situations in future.

Disaster management is linked with sustainable development, particularly in relation to vulnerable people such as those with disabilities, elderly people, children and other marginalized groups.

In view of the above, Geography Department of Govt. College Dharamshala organized one day training/mock drill program on disaster management for students in collaboration with Disaster Management Cell in the office of Deputy Commissioner, Kangra at Dharamshala on

19th March 2019 in college auditorium. Around 500 students of the college attended this training/mock drill and get benefitted from it.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The students of the department of psychology attended a special training on “Drug –de-addiction” at “Gunjan” Dharamshala, organized by ministry of social justice and empowerment from 25th feb. 2019 to 11th March 2019.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

The department organized a workshop on the “Principles of Physics” in collaboration with central university of Himachal Pradesh. Prof. M.G. Tarenekar from Calcutta university demonstrated the basic principles of physics for the students of the physics department and workshop ended as an eye- opener to the students. Besides, the department also organized a lecture on the topic “Three quantum Indians” in which Prof. P.K. Ahluwalia retired as Dean H.P. University presented his valuable views on the topic. This lecture was also organized in collaboration with the central university of Himachal Pradesh.
